TONIGHT'S MEETING - 25 JULY 2023

Guest Speaker - Michael Kirby-Lewis

Michael Kirby-Lewis ('Kirby") is a highly experienced IT professional who, notably, for nine years from 2007 to 2016 was the Chief Information Officer (CIO) for the University of NSW.

Security has occupied an increasing part of Kirby's day job over the past 20 years. This experience includes recent work as CIO for GP Synergy from 2017-22 to gain certification under ISO27001, which is the international standard for information security.

In his talk, Kirby will provide us with a basic understanding of the technical components but will spend most of his time on the weakest link – the human factor. How hackers go about social engineering and what you can do to minimise your risk of being hacked or scammed. He will talk about the various kinds of hackers as well as some of the latest tactics being used. Hackers are no longer just focused on emails, computers and web sites – their exploits go much further than that.

Kirby has over 40 years' IT experience, mostly in Senior Management roles. He studied computer science in Christchurch, NZ, did his Masters at UNSW and has undertaken Executive programs at the Harvard Business School.

Kirby has worked in the Health, Manufacturing, Distribution, Consulting and Education industries within both the Public and Private sectors. He was President/ Chair of the Council of Australasian Universities IT Directors (2014-16). He has a keen interest in developing leadership skills and was a member of the teaching faculty for the Australasian University Leadership Program (2013-19).

NEXT MEETING - 8 AUGUST 2023

Guest Speaker - Don Napper

"The Sad Life of Francis Greenway, our First Government Architect"

Emeritus Professor Don Napper was educated at Sydney and Cambridge Universities in molecular chemistry. He retired from Sydney University in 2003 as the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Sciences & Technology), where he is now Professor Emeritus.

Don will talk about Francis Greenway's life.

Francis Greenway's death sentence for forgery in England was commuted to transportation to NSW for 14 years. Governor Macquarie appointed Greenway as our first Government Architect in which role he designed some 80 buildings. Less than one-quarter of these remain today. After Macquarie left the colony, Greenway fell upon hard times. He died completely unsung and the location of his pauper's grave in the East Maitland Cemetery remains unknown.

services.

We are accompanied by three Timor Leste "dental nurses" who help us provide the

necessary treatment.

An important part of our mission is to increase the skill and knowledge base of these

young clinicians.

Training is accomplished by after hours tutorial style education which is then supplemented by clinical oversight and instruction during the working day.

Several dental teams travel each year to provide dental care to remote & rural communities in Timor-Leste & support East Timorese dental workers with training, equipment & mentoring. Rotary program, based in Maubara; Lions program, based in Dili.

WORK ACHIEVED BY TEAM

The team examined and provided timely dental treatment 1126 people in rural Timor Leste.

importantly, it is great opportunity to increase the clinical skills of our local colleagues so that they may provide better and a wider range of treatments to their local communities.

We saw many children with chronic dental pain which undoubtedly was affecting their ability to eat well and study effectively. Treatment ranged from extraction of abscessed teeth, Silver Fluoride application plus restoration to halt dental decay, conventional restorations and dental scaling of teeth

Our local colleagues were also able to provide oral health education individually and in classroom settings.

ACCOMMODATION DETAILS

Accomodation was sourced through the Carmelite Sisters in Maubara, the Jesuit Order in Railacao and Kassai and at Bethania in Maliana.

These places can organise food for a team.

Bedding and bathroom facilities were commensurate with where we were in rural Timor Leste with Bethania in Maliana better than the average.

Mosquitos were prevalent and nets, coils and medication is advised.

Don't drive at night and if not confident, employ a local guide/driver.
