

A Surreal Experience for Toula and Victor in Marrakech

As families continue their desperate search for loved ones following the earthquake in Morocco, Toula and Victor Serna recalled their own experience in Toula's message:

"A holiday with a twist! It was a surreal experience for sure. A little moment in time that has had a great impact in many. We feel so sorry for the dead and injured. We also witnessed people with their homes cracked and unliveable. Fortunately for us, when the earthquake hit Marrakech, we were in an open square. It was 11pm and we were heading back to our hotel. We felt the earth move but we were not at risk of debris. A couple of hours later, we risked a possible aftershock to go back to our hotel in the old city to extract our passports and luggage. There were damaged buildings along the way and we walked across rubble, but our hotel was fortunately undamaged. We then spent the night in the open square with thousands. At first light we took the first train out of Marrakech and are now in Casablanca."

Since then they have flown to Rome and Toula said "It feels wonderful to be alive and we're trying not to dwell about what could have happened."

We are very grateful that our friends are safe.
