Country NSW IT Student Tour (DIGIT)

I have committed our Club to this 6 day program from May 14. As a teacher who taught in 3 country schools before EBHS, I am very aware of the educational inequality between rural and urban NSW. See below for more detail and contact me if you can either billet or help with the transport.

Hi Bruce,

It was good to chat on the phone this morning. We appreciate your help with billeting 3 or 4 students, depending on final numbers and gender split.

After a 3 year Covid hiatus the tour is back this year, running from Sunday evening 14th May through to Friday morning 19th May.

In partnership with the Rotary clubs of Inverell and Forbes, we source 4 local State High School year 10 students from each area and bring them to Sydney for a week. The local Rotary clubs organise and pay for the students' transport costs to Sydney.

The students are billeted with club members or friends for the 5 nights. Our Rotarians collect the students from Hornsby and Strathfield stations, on Sunday afternoon/evening and deliver them to their host families. Host families are required to provide dinner on the Sunday and Monday nights. The students need to be dropped off at Dunmore Lang College each morning at the appropriate time. They will be delivered home each evening by our supervising Rotarians. We cover dinner for the students on the other nights.

Our club Rotarians take the students to visit organisations like Cisco, Coles Distribution, Google, IBM, Konica Minolta, Macquarie Uni, Microsoft, Optus, Oracle and UTS. The idea is to showcase how technology is used in businesses these days and what job opportunities might look like after school. Our club covers all of the students' costs while they are in Sydney.

We have activities for the students on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and a dinner for the students on Thursday night at RDA, where the students give a short presentation on their individual experiences for the week. We pick up the students from their host families on Friday morning and deliver them to their trains.

Hope this covers the running of the project. Appreciate your help.

Ukraine Update from a Rotary Perspective

For just over a year now we have all been watching and reading about the appalling situation in Ukraine as a result of the Russian Invasion - Putin's "special operation"! The utter devastation and loss of life is horrific.

Before the war there were 64 Rotary Clubs in Ukraine. In fact Rotary's General Secretary, John Hewko, is a member of the Rotary Club of Kyiv. Despite the fact that 8 million residents have left the country, there are still 64 functioning Rotary Clubs and the total membership has increased!

The Rotary Foundation has funded 441 disaster response grants to benefit desperate people in Ukraine and refugees who have left their country. The total funding is US\$14.5 million. World wide 274 Districts have sponsored a grant.

For those people still inside Ukraine the grants (US\$10.8m) have funded medical equipment and supplies, basic needs such as food furniture and toiletries, temporary housing, emergency responses and educational equipment.

Outside Ukraine, grants totalling US3.7m have provided refugee support which has included housing, food, clothing, medicine, furniture, legal assistance and hygiene kits.

It's time this war was over.
