Co-Presidents' Corner

International Women's Day was Tuesday Monday 8 March. This week's meeting acknowledged this significant occasion with our guest speaker, Dr Mayada Kayali, President of the Women's International Club Canberra. Maya, of Palestinian-Jordanian background has an impressive resume. She attended University in Cairo and studied and lived in Glasgow for 7 years, attaining a PhD in Pharmacology. Maya describes herself as a scientist, humanist and gender advocate.



Maya shared her personal story with us, outlining the cultural differences she faced as a woman when she and her husband came to Australia 37 years ago and settled in Canberra. As a professional woman, working in Federal Health, Maya described her experiences and struggles as a woman working in a Western environment but at home living as a Middle Eastern wife. After a day at work, she took on all household responsibilities of looking after the house and 3 children – cooking meals, organising them for school etc. It didn't occur to her that things weren't equal. However, she made changes and it is heartening for Maya that her adult

daughters are in relationships built on the sharing of responsibilities. Whilst the voice of women in the Middle East is increasing, it is still a patriarchal society where men dominate, have the power and hold privileges whilst women shoulder the burdens and continue on quietly. Divorce is a stigma, and whilst men can gain a divorce easily, for women it is much harder.

Maya believes it is up to women to challenge inequality. Reflecting on the past is important to see the changes that have occurred and the progress made, particularly in the 20th century. However, there is still

some way to go e.g. statistics show that men are twice as likely to be paid \$120,000+ than women. The glass ceiling continues to exist. International Women's Day is a time to honour and celebrate acts of courage by all women and to continue to strive for equality in every aspect of life.

Maya is an inspirational woman and her presentation was interesting, informative and engaging.

As Hillary Clinton stated, "Women are the largest untapped reservoir of talent in the world."

District Governor's Message (extract)

I'm pleased to announce D9685 has been granted a **Rotary Foundation Disaster Response Grant** of US\$25,000 (AU\$34,500) to provide prompt relief to people in D9685 in urgent need as a result of the current flooding. Rotary Clubs with members in the Windsor area (Windsor and The Ponds) are already planning to distribute Bunnings and Woolworths Gift Cards to impacted families.

This Disaster Grant is very welcome, but it won't go very far in meeting the needs of people in the area.

Clubs in D9685 have asked how they can support people in our local area mainly centred along the Nepean and Hawkesbury River system.

RAWCS has now approved our application for a District 9685 Rotary Australia Benevolent Society project to raise funds for flood victims in our local area.

Flood Relief for Families in the Sydney Region of NSW (RABS) Project 53-2021-22 is now open to support from clubs and receive tax deductible donations from Rotarians and the public. The QR Code below will take you to the Donate page for this project.

The D9685 Grants committee will work with clubs in the impacted areas as a panel to determine how relief will be urgently distributed and managed.
