So, we will be meeting at Rydalmere Wharf at 8.30am. We will follow the riverside path under James Ruse Drive and on towards Parramatta Wharf where we can check out the spectacular new pathway and bridge under construction. Return to The University where we will have a coffee before doing a tour of one of Sydney's most historic buildings. This has been arranged for 10.00am so numbers attending are important to me this time. I will send around a sign-on list at our meeting next Monday night. If you are unable to put your name onto that list, then please text or email me and let me know that it is your intention to come along. The walk will go on irrespective of weather.

For those who don't know, The Female Orphan School was Sydney's first three storey building and was opened in 1818. It has an interesting story to tell. Today it houses the Whitlam Institute, the Whitlam Prime Ministerial Collection and the Margaret Whitlam Galleries. These are all absolutely fascinating and they are free. I am certain that those who came last time will not be put off by doing this again.

Our walking time is about 50 minutes each way (1h, 40mins total) but because of the tour, I do not expect to be back at the cars until 11.00am.

This is the last walk in the current series. I can be only guided by your response. Numbers coming along have been down and unless there is significant commitment for continuing, it is my intention to bring these to an end for the time being. As some of you may know, I am currently putting on fortnightly history walks with The Bush Club and anyone is invited to come along on these as a guest.


