Co-Presidents' Corner

In a week of terrible news about major floods in Queensland and Northern NSW and the commencement of a senseless war in Ukraine, Rotarians came together on Monday to find ways to make the world a better place.



In a first such initiative in a few years, we held a **joint meeting with West Pennant Hills/Cherrybrook Rotary Club** on Monday. Twenty two members and partners of the visiting club joined a similar number of the Rotary Club of Epping at the Epping Hotel. We shared information about each other's clubs and discovered we have a lot in common, such as the size of the clubs and the focus on youth programs. We shared experiences and got to know each other better. The evening was deemed a great success and the Epping Rotary Club was invited to reciprocate the visit at a future date.

To complete a great evening, we heard from our guest speaker **Rob Edwards** about his foundation and the sustainability projects he initiated in Fiji.

Through his *It's Time Foundation*, and over the last decade, Rob has been installing solar energy systems in remote schools in Fiji. He replaces the costly and intermittent power produced by generators with 24-hour clean electricity for free. By saving resource-poor schools the cost of power, schools can better fund essentials such as books, libraries, and technology. Through solar power, an average school saves the equivalent of AUD \$8000 a year.

The installation of solar power systems is complex and requires coordination with local authorities, miles of cabling and a lot of manpower. Rotary has funded part of his projects since 2013. His Foundation however, is always seeking grants and donations to fund projects in more schools.

Another way Rob funds projects is through a cleverly designed **lottery scheme** which is available to all Rotary Clubs. All funds raised through the sale of the lottery tickets are split equally between the It's Time Foundation and the participating Rotary Club. The ticket sales are done online, and the management of the lottery is done through his Foundation, which means that the only responsibility of the club is to promote the lottery. The prizes are substantial and lucrative and the computerised system provides the participating club with real-time reporting. It's a win-win!

Another environmental sustainability project that Rob initiated is **Plastic-free Oceans**. He encourages school students in Fiji to commit to picking up plastics on beaches each week for 30 minutes. Plastics in oceans are an environmental catastrophe. Plastics in our oceans kill 200,000 dolphins a year. There are estimates that by 2050, there will be more plastic than fish by weight in the oceans. He has extended this project by inviting Rotary Clubs to be leaders in this field. He proposes that Rotary Club members commit to 1 hour monthly on their walks, inviting members of the community in the area to join in.

Rob Edwards is truly inspiring and a man with an amazing talent of translating innovative ideas into practical reality. We wish him the best and will certainly be participating in some of his initiatives.

MoPH condemns the senseless killing of the polio workers in Kunduz and Takhar provinces

Friday, February 25, 2022:

Yesterday, eight polio workers, four of them women, were killed by unknown gunmen in separate attacks in Kunduz and Takhar provinces.

Three male and one female vaccinator were gunned down in the outskirts of Kunduz city, while two vaccinators and a social mobilizer were killed in Imam Sahib district of the same province, and one male vaccinator was killed in Taloqan city of Takhar province.

The cause and intention of the attack remain unknown, and security officials have launched an investigation.

Following these unfortunate incidents, the polio vaccination campaign in Takhar and Kunduz provinces was stopped to prevent further attacks and to protect the safety of other vaccinators.

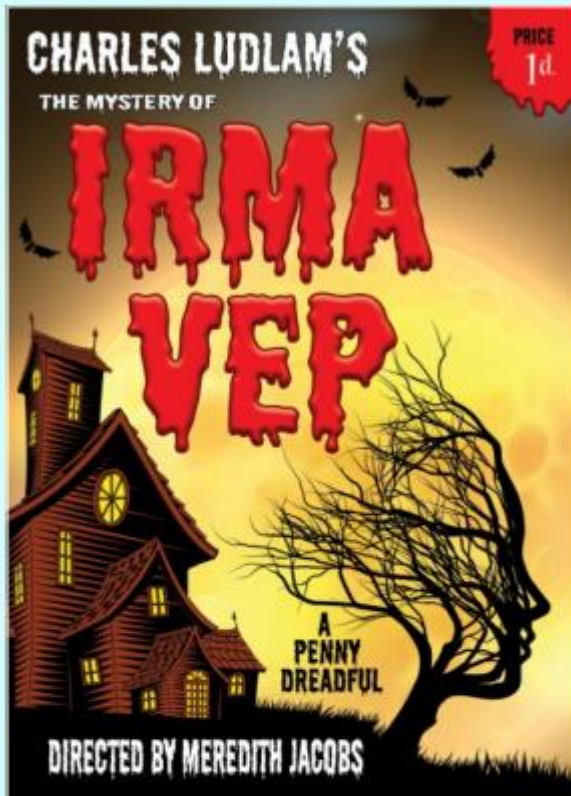
The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan strongly condemns the attack on polio workers and calls for the perpetrators to be prosecuted, arrested, and punished. The ministry also expresses its sympathy and condolences to the bereaved families, relatives, colleagues, and friends.

May Allah, Almighty rest their departed souls in eternal peace and give strength to their families to bear these irreparable losses.

The Polio programme expresses deepest condolences to the families and friends of the fallen polio workers and appreciates their courageous efforts to save children's lives and protect them from polio disease.

The government of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan remains committed to ending polio and will provide security assurances to all frontline workers everywhere in the country.

Tonga Tsunami Appeal: D9685 has made a direct contribution of AUD \$10,000 to purchase 5 SkyHydrant water filters being shipped free of charge. Each unit can produce 500 litres per hour, are gravity fed and require no chemicals. Requested by Her Majesty the Queen of Tonga via the Hon Consul in NSW they will be delivered to Rotary District 9920 that includes Tonga. District 9685 urgently needs an additional \$4,500
