District Governor's Message

Greetings Fellow Rotarians,

As I work through my official club visits schedule, I continue to be impressed with the projects that our Rotarians are involved in. Regardless of their size, clubs are working successfully in their communities and globally, making a measurable difference as people of action.

An exciting project that shows the power of Rotary is the ABCD (Association of Bell, Clarence and Dargan) Hall project. In the 2019-20 bushfires these small communities in the upper Blue Mountains were devastated with a huge loss of homes and habitat. They also lost the only place where the community could meet. A miracle arrived in the form of a generous anonymous donation to RAWCS for bushfireaffected communities and we were able to secure \$140,000 to rebuild the hall. On Sunday, the grateful community gathered to 'turn the sod' and get the building underway. If we are successful with our Global Grant application Rotary can also contribute to the fitting out of the building and provision of water tanks. This project is about more than providing a space, it is about building community and developing resilience.

I've been asking members to take a really good look at their club culture and how it may look to an outside observer. One suggestion is to bring along a non-Rotarian with the express view of asking them to provide some feedback of their visit. They may need to attend more than once. Often, we are so used to the way we are operating that we are oblivious to things that may present a barrier to a new person joining. Having someone you trust to give some honest feedback may provide your members with something to work on to make your club meetings more attractive.

Last week I was privileged to attend Australian Rotary Health's (ARH) 'Healthy Children- Bright Futures. Improving the Mental Health of 0-12 Year Olds' Symposium. This is ARH's new research grant funding focus. Excellent research reports were presented by doctors and professors from around Australia to show the urgent need for this work. Please consider supporting ARH when you have funds to disperse.

The Regionalisation Team have successfully completed their visits to all clubs, and presidents will be asked to vote on your behalf very soon. The feedback is positive for a 'yes' vote so let's hope that the other districts allow us the chance to trial new ways of managing Rotary in Zone 8 – Australia, New Zealand and the South Pacific. Again, I'd like to give a big thank you to PDG Kalma McClellan and her team.

Meanwhile, continue the good work and let everyone know about it! Start thinking about the hiking stick that you will bring to the Cowra Conference and register for the International Convention in Melbourne. Look after each other and enjoy what you are doing.
