President lan's Report

Last Monday we heard an excellent presentation from John Steuart on setting up a pharmaceuticals manufacturing business in Mongolia. Following the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, Mongolia was left with very limited infrastructure and almost no local manufacturing. By 2005 the entire country had only one solitary dialysis unit for kidney disease patients.

John established an IV solution manufacturing plant, first using French technology and later using Korean equipment to expand the plant and introduce the manufacture of plastic vials with injectable drugs. Two huge warehouses now hold several months reserves of IV fluids and injectables for hospitals all across Mongolia. There are also over 50 dialysis machines in Mongolia today. All of these measures have seen the average age of Mongolians steadily rise during the time that John has been working in Mongolia.



Question: If you were starting a business in a country where the average <u>monthly</u> income was \$550 Au, what would you pay your staff?

Would you pay them 5 times the average salary, roughly \$33,000 per year or 10 times the average salary at \$66,000 per year.

If you can answer that question, you will understand why all of the local motor vehicle manufacturers left Australia in the 1990's.

John Steuart, TAS Old Boy from 1965, gave an inspirational and outstanding presentation to The Epping Rotary

Club members and visitors on September 4, last Monday.

John had a professional career for around 30 years working primarily overseas. In particular he worked for DHL, the leading global logistics company which specialises in international shipping, courier services and transportation.

John was able to utilise these skills when asked in 2002 to help establish an intravenous solution (I/V) industry in Mongolia. Previously the I/V industry in Mongolia had an unreliable supply from overseas, primarily Russia, and questionable quality and standards. John became Chair in 2003 and 20 years later his company has become an industry of world best standard status.

It has made a huge contribution to improving living standards in Mongolia and longer life expectancy. As well, in recent years, some of the "profits" have resulted in new medical clinics and schoolrooms. Other TAS Old Boys, George Souris, Pete Williams, Paddy Flower and myself attended as well as John's partner Jackie and daughter Jessica, and EBHS teacher, Ron Bradford. Geoff Saville, Olga and her friend also attended this special night.

An amazing presentation and what a contribution John and his team have made in Mongolia. Thank you John.

One grace that has arisen from this sad and tragic event has been the kindness and generosity shown by people from all over the world, including, of course, our wonderful, thoughtful, and kind friends and fellow Rotarians in Australia.
