Co-presidents' Corner



On Monday night, we enjoyed hearing about Allowah Presbyterian Children's Hospital in Dundas. Jon Flood, Director of Partner Ministries and Taryn Clausing Family Liaison and Care Coordinator shared general information, stories and video clips. Time allowed us the opportunity to ask many questions of Jon and Taryn.

For the past 70 years, Allowah has been providing quality medical care to 120 children (0-18 years) with complex medical conditions. It is the only hospital of its kind in Australia.

Allowah has 44 hospital beds and provides 24/7 nursing care for some children who live there full time. Other children may attend for the week or weekend, when parents need some respite. After School Care and School Holiday Programs also operate there. There are approximately 70 full time equivalent staff – therapists, nurses, admin workers, caterers working together to ensure this incredible facility functions well.

Taryn spoke about the 'My Time' support group she facilitates for parents. This provides the opportunity for parents to share their experiences and information on resources they have accessed that may be helpful to others.

In the past, Allowah has had a sustainable financial model but since Covid-19 hit (and which continues to have an impact), these last 2 years have been particularly challenging, in regards to their revenue. The Hospital relies on admissions and its School Holiday Program for cashflow and at the moment are only operating with 40% admissions. They are aiming for 80% which would help considerably. Whilst they have recently received a total of \$262,000 Government funding, Allowah needs more and so have set up a 'Keep The Doors Open' campaign with a \$2million goal. Much of the money to date towards the campaign has come from fundraising by the Presbyterian churches. Jon told us that Allowah is encouraging the community to help in 3 ways:



- Spread the word about Allowah
- Donate, particularly regular monthly donations
- Fundraise through their online platform Raisley. Groups can put up their organisation's details and encourage donations to be made to the organisation's fundraising page for Allowah. The Hospital would love to hear from people who have contacts in the corporate world that could partner with Allowah and provide them financial assistance and, in return, be promoted on their website and media platforms.

Allowah is keen for its relationship with the Rotary Club of Epping to continue and it was suggested that we could have a future Monday night meeting at Allowah. Our Rotary Board will explore ways to support the Allowah Presbyterian Children's Hospital, and, in the meantime, will donate \$1000, as part of our end of Rotary year 'giving'.

Epping Rotary Through the Years – an Impressive History

In the lead up to our Club's 60th Anniversary here is a summary of the first decade of our great club:

The Golden Eighties (1982-91)

The Club

During this decade membership reached is highest to date at 72 with a wide range of classifications. Meetings were quite formal with the Loyal Toast, a sung Grace, the National Anthem and a Sergeant conducting a fine session, usually with humour. The dress code was strictly suit and tie, attendance was monitored closely and singing featured at each meeting with an annual contest between Ryde or Carlingford Clubs. Members assisted with the serving of meals and clearing the tables. Ladies were invited each quarter. There weren't any female members until 1993. Several workplace visits were included in the program each year. Raffles were not generally accepted as an acceptable way to fundraise.

Social outings such as family picnics, weekends away for both families and members only ("bucks weekends"), theatre parties, progressive dinners and woolshed dances and BBQs were well attended.

A Decade of Club Presidents

Leading the Club in those years were: Bob Paisley (1981-82), Ken Dobinson (1982-83), Alan Thomas (1983-84), Keith Chinchen (1984-85), Russ Walker (1985-86), Doug Rae (1986-87), Paul Clune (1987-88), John Goddard (1988-89), Ron Hinton (1989-90) and Cees Thurmer (1990-91).

Service Projects

Members' construction and painting skills were well utilised with the construction of a cabin at Camp Breakaway at San Remo on the Central Coast. This was to house children with disabilities having a holiday. A garage was built at Christian Community Aid at Eastwood and two second-hand caravans were stripped and fitted out - one for the Eastwood Police as a mobile police station and one for St John's Ambulance. The latter earned the Club a Sydney Morning Herald a Community Service Award.

The Club participated in the organisation of two concerts at the Opera House to support Microsearch, ran the District Assembly in 1987, collected for the Salvation Army's annual Red Shield Appeal, formed 3 more Probus Clubs, donated generously to Polio Plus which started in 1985, conducted flea markets, worked at the Dalmar, Karonga and Minimbah fetes and Carols in Forest Park and at Channel 7. Pride of Workmanship and Austerity nights were annual highlights.

International projects included tools for vocational training and medical equipment for PNG, a well in Bangladesh, hospital beds to the Solomon Islands and high protein food for young children in India.

In 1984 Epping Rotary was asked to be the Trustee of the Langston Award, a scholarship for the most outstanding local Primary School student. The Club continued with Youth Exchange, RYLA, RYPEN, MUNA, Science Summer School, High School Debates and sponsoring disadvantaged children to camps at Vision Valley. As part of the "Trees for Survival" project, a shadehouse to nurture young trees was constructed at Epping West PS.

MUNA - June 18 - 19.

Epping Rotary will again sponsor two teams from EBHS at this year's MUNA. The sponsorship is courtesy by Epping Commitment Bank (Bendigo Bank) with whom we have a wonderful relationship.

It will again be held at EBHS and is being organised by Beecroft Rotary who took over from Epping Rotary. I suggest come along and witness this great Rotary leadership developing event.
