Country NSW IT Student Tour (DIGIT)

I have committed our Club to this 6 day program from May 14. As a teacher who taught in 3 country

schools before EBHS, I am very aware of the educational inequality between rural and urban NSW. See below for more detail and contact me if you can either billet or help with the transport.

Hi Bruce,

It was good to chat on the phone this morning. We appreciate your help with billeting 3 or 4 students, depending on final numbers and gender split.

After a 3 year Covid hiatus the tour is back this year, running from Sunday evening 14th May through to Friday morning 19th May.

In partnership with the Rotary clubs of Inverell and Forbes, we source 4 local State High School year 10 students from each area and bring them to Sydney for a week. The local Rotary clubs organise and pay for the students' transport costs to Sydney.

The students are billeted with club members or friends for the 5 nights. Our Rotarians collect the students from Hornsby and Strathfield stations, on Sunday afternoon/evening and deliver them to their host families. Host families are required to provide dinner on the Sunday and Monday nights. The students need to be dropped off at Dunmore Lang College each morning at the appropriate time. They will be delivered home each evening by our supervising Rotarians. We cover dinner for the students on the other nights.

Our club Rotarians take the students to visit organisations like Cisco, Coles Distribution, Google, IBM, Konica Minolta, Macquarie Uni, Microsoft, Optus, Oracle and UTS. The idea is to showcase how technology is used in businesses these days and what job opportunities might look like after school. Our club covers all of the students' costs while they are in Sydney.

We have activities for the students on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and a dinner for the students on Thursday night at RDA, where the students give a short presentation on their individual experiences for the week. We pick up the students from their host families on Friday morning and deliver them to their trains.

Hope this covers the running of the project. Appreciate your help.

Greetings from Ikebukuro

April is the season for cherry blossom viewing in Japan, when the cherry blossoms bloom. Sydney, on the other hand, is about to turn chilly in autumn, and I hear that April 9th is a celebration of Easter.

In July 2022, Tokyo Ikebukuro Rotary Club and Tokyo Toshima East Club merged to form Tokyo Ikebukuro Toshima East Rotary Club. Your club and the Rotary Club of Tokyo Ikebukuro have enjoyed friendship and goodwill since May 17, 1971, when your club became a sister club with the Rotary Club of Tokyo Ikebukuro. After the merger, we continue the history and tradition of both clubs. In 2019, the Rugby World Cup was held in Japan. On October 31st, Rotarians from your club attended our club's traveling luncheon at the Mitsui Club near the Australian Embassy in Mita, Minato-ku, where we had a friendly chat. After that, unfortunately, the interaction between both clubs has been delayed due to the Covid-19.

Japanese historical novelist Ryotaro Shiba wrote a work titled "A Night Party on Thursday Island". From the early Meiji period until before the Pacific War, many Japanese were engaged in pearl oyster harvesting on

Thursday Island at the northern tip of Australia. They were not harvesting pearls, but buttons from the shells. Looking back on history, there have been sad moments, but the relationship between

Japan and Australia will become more important than ever, not only in terms of politics and economy, but also in terms of culture. The Rotary Convention in May 2023 will be held in Melbourne, Australia. After our club participates in the international convention, we plan to stop by Sydney and visit your club meeting

I hope that both clubs will deepen their friendship and goodwill more than ever, and that they will serve as a bridge between Japan and Australia. I also wish your club's prosperity and the health of all its members. I look forward to seeing you and the koalas in May.

Paul Harris Fellow Recognitions

Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) recognitions were established in 1957 to honour the founder of Rotary, Paul Harris, to express appreciation for a contribution of US\$1,000 to the humanitarian and educational programs of The Rotary Foundation.

How does one become a Paul Harris Fellow?

- by donating either in one transaction or over time US\$1,000
- by being nominated by someone who has donated US\$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation
- by being nominated by a Rotary club that has donated US\$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation

Rotarians and clubs designate a PHF to recognise a person (who could be a Rotarian, a family member of a Rotarian or a community member) whose life demonstrates a shared purpose with the objectives and mission of The Rotary Foundation to build world understanding and peace.

Subsequent donations to TRF of US\$1,000 are recognised with "stones" designated as "sapphire" or "rubies".

At present our club has 24 PHFs, 14 of those with sapphires or rubies in their badges. Over the club's 60 years 171 PHFs and sapphire pins have been given to members, partners or community members!
