Drivers needed for Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal



On Sunday 21 May, Epping Rotary will support students from Epping Boys High School by driving them to areas for the students to door knock for the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal. We expect there will be 25-30 students and therefore need approximately 9 volunteer drivers. The exact number will of course depend on how many students, members can take in their cars.

At 9.30am, drivers would be required to pick up the students (from Epping Boys High School) and take them to designated areas for them to do their 'house to house' donation

collecting. Drivers would be given maps of the areas for collecting. 2 boys do one side of a road and another 2 do the opposite side. Drivers may wish to just wait for the boys as they go door knocking or they may like to get involved too. The boys would then be taken to the counting centre at the Ryde Baptist Church at Top Ryde (on Lane Cove Road, just south of Quarry Road) to pass on the donations collected, enjoy a sausage at the 'sausage sizzle' and then returned to the school. Overall, it should take around 3 hours.

Prior to the 21 May, the boys will be sent an email with a video of what is expected. Drivers will also be able to view this video to provide insight into the expectations of the collectors.

Please note, drivers must have a current Working With Children Check.


