Co-Presidents' Corner

Our special guests for Monday night were Bob Kaye Smith and Geoff Brennan of Australian Rotary Health. We record 31 people at the hybrid meeting, enjoying the fellowship and eager to learn more about an institution that is universally admired.

Despite some technical sound issues, Geoff delivered an enlightening talk and encouraged the club to use the national profile of ARH for fundraising activities through increased community engagement. The Rotary Club of Epping has been a consistent supporter of ARH over many years. In fact, the club raised \$3000 for ARH during lockdown through our Walkathon initiative.

Australian Rotary Health



ARH's current programs are in the areas of Mental Health Research, All Health Areas Research, Indigenous Health Scholarships and Rural Medical and Nursing Scholarships. Since 1985 ARH has supported Australian researchers to the tune of \$50 million.

Last year ARH raised \$1.3 million, of which \$84,000 was from District 9685. Donations are made by the Australian public, Rotary clubs, individual Rotarians, commercial organisations, charitable trusts, and bequests.

Since the year 2000, the major focus of ARH has been on Mental Health research.

In 2012, the focus narrowed to Mental Health of young Australians.

In 2022, this will again narrow to the Mental Health of 0-12 years old because research has shown that approximately 14% or 500,000 children in this age range suffer from a mental disorder.

Medical Adviser to the ARH Board of Directors Professor Michael Sawyer OAM says that "mental disorders have a major adverse effect on the well-being of children and their families, and on the education outcomes of children. There is also evidence that approximately 50% of mental disorders across all age groups have their onset by the age of 14 years. The time between birth and 12 years is a very important developmental period where successes and failures can cascade down the years"

Some of ARH sponsored research results over the years:

SIDS (cot death) reduced by 80%

Mental Health First Aid - A program now used in 22 countries to teach members of the public to recognise symptoms of mental health problems and how to give initial help

Motor Neurone Disease - A simple urine test has been developed to detect and monitor the progression of motor neurone disease in patients

Lung Transplant Program - Patients are achieving a 95% survival rate after 2 years and the number of deaths while on the waiting list has reduced from 29% to 3%

Your Rotary Legacy

As our Queen said recently "none of us will live forever." So, what will be our legacy when we have departed this life?

My husband, Geoff and I have given nearly 70 years of Rotary service between us and we have thoroughly enjoyed doing what we can to make our world a better place. To ensure that our work will continue when we are no longer able to, we have included a bequest to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International in our Wills. We have discussed this with our two daughters and they are wholeheartedly in agreement as they know how much Rotary has meant to us.

Since November is Rotary Foundation month, I encourage all members to consider a bequest to The Rotary Foundation. This could be in the form of a cash gift, a percentage of your estate, property, shares or other assets in your Will. Four Epping Rotarians have done this already. You will be recognised as a Benefactor with a bequest of any amount. For a bequest of US\$10,000 you will become a member of the Bequest Society. Bequests of US\$25,000 and more can bear your name or your family's name or the name of a loved one. It may also be possible to direct those funds to specific programs or regions. We have Rotarians in our district who have advised of bequests of US\$1 million!

I have attached a sample Codicil and a brochure about the program and various recognition levels. We always suggest that you contact your financial adviser and legal adviser about your plans. Please contact me if you wish to know more about leaving a legacy to The Rotary Foundation.

How to include Rotary in your estate plan One of the most popular ways to include Rotary in an estate plan is through a will or codicil.

Whichever method works best for you, please remember to use the official legal name, **The** Rotary Foundation of Rotary International, ne of the following names applies in the region where you live:

- The Rotary Foundation (Canada)
- Rotary Foundation (India)
- Public Interest Incorporated Foundation Rotary Foundation Japan
- . Rotary Foundation of the United Kingdom

- For a general gift of a certain percentage or portion of your estate: "I give to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International one-fourth of my estate."
- For a gift of a specific asset: "I give 500 shares of [name] stock to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International."
- For a contingent bequest, which takes effect only when certain conditions are met: "In the event my spouse does not survive me, I give to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International the remainder of my estate."

A Trip to Picton


The district is rich in Aboriginal and European history. A colourful tapestry interweaves the Dreamtime legends of the Gundungurra, Darug and Dharawal people on a backdrop of gorges, ranges and plains with a rural patchwork created by the white settlers who followed the first fleet's famous straying cattle to the Cowpastures.


Picton is one of the earliest European settlements. It was 'discovered' when a number of cattle went missing in the early days of the colony and were found in 1795 by a convict near the Nepean River.

The valuable herd, which had increased in number, were allowed to remain and breed in a sealed-off area stretching from the Nepean to the Bargo River.

This became known as Cowpastures and then Stonequarry until 1841. The name Picton is believed to have been chosen to honour Sir Thomas Picton, an old soldier friend of Governor Brisbane.

In the 1860s the railway system came to Picton and created a building explosion. The area was proclaimed a municipality in 1895, and in 1939 Wollondilly Shire Council (then centred in The Oaks) and Picton Municipality amalgamated to create the Shire that we have today.





Here are the details:

- It will take just over one hour to drive to Picton down the M5.
- Meet in Picton at 11.30am at the Rotunda.
- Parking is available at Davidson Lane car park off Menangle St West.
- If coming from the Hume H'Way, you will arrive in town right at the main intersection (look for the clock tower on the Old Post Office). Go straight ahead into Menangle St West then turn left into Davidson Lane car park. This is very central to everything & we can use the toilets at the Hotel Picton.
- There is a Rotunda on the edge of the car park/ cemetery which has seating & as it's raised, we can see each other easily.
- President Mark Hardacre (Picton Rotary and Lyn (Secretary) will aim to meet us at the Rotunda depending on their other commitments.
- 12.00pm Historical walk around Picton village & St Mark's Cemetery (audio tour is available at extra cost)
- 1.00pm lunch
- 2.30pm make way back to Sydney (or wherever)
- On the way out, you might like to have a look at the Stonequarry Viaduct which you can drive to on Picton Avenue plenty of parking area & The old Mushroom Tunnel.
