- Distributes Bowelscan kits through local chemist in an effort to detect early signs of bowel cancer, saving lives.
- Supports Interplast, medical teams who have transformed the lives of thousands.
- Provides assistance to local families in need, helping to make their lives better.
- Provide support to the Kincumber Neighbourhood Centre through a Rotary District Grant \$6,000 to fund food parcels and container refrigerator
- Support the local Days for Girls Avoca Beach team providing washable and reusable sanitary

kits to girls and women in developing countries.

- Eradication of polio

Rotary International has set itself the goal of eradicating polio worldwide. Since 1979 Rotary has contributed more than \$1.2 billion and immunised more than 2 billion children. From 2007 the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, working with Rotary, has committed \$1.9 billion to the fight against polio. Since 1985 polio cases have declined by 99%. In 2013 India was declared polio free.

- Other Rotary International projects include:

- Alleviation of poverty and hunger and supply of clean water in third world countries.
- Shelter Boxes, which are large emergency relief boxes that each can accommodate and provide clean water for up to 10 displaced people after natural disasters.
- Wheelchairs for disabled children and adults in Cambodia.
- Support for Dr Andrew Browning's work in hospitals in Tanzania.
