The President's Year in Review - Bernie Mason 2023-2024

The Rotary Club of North Ryde is a small club, and we have continued our great traditions, and introduced some new ones in keeping with Past President Sandeep Rathi's vision for the future of the Club.

- **Collaboration** joining hands with other Rotary Clubs to achieve more.
- **Community Spirit** encouraging and celebrating the coming together of people.
- Championing our Youth empowering youth and young professionals.

We have 17 members, one honorary member and four new Friends of the Club.

We meet three times a month: two meetings via Zoom and one face-to-face Club Assembly at Dunmore Lang College (including Zoom for those at home.)

Throughout the year, **Garry Maloney and Rob Wilkinson** have kept us entertained and educated, by organising many wonderful speakers to present to our members. These guest speakers are presented with a Gro Tree, as our thanks. Each Gro-Tree certificate sees a tree planted by Landcare, currently at Lithgow, creating green corridors for our wonderful country. Go and hug a tree and claim it as your own.

When I became President, my aim was to have **more open collaboration within our cluster clubs** and open our eyes to other projects we could help with, locally, nationally, and internationally. I also wanted people in our community to know who we are and what we do. I think we have achieved that as a club.

I would like to thank the **other clubs of our District**, who took the time to invite us into their meetings and listen to their guest speakers. In keeping with our community spirit, we have collaborated with many Rotary Clubs on our projects including: **The Epping Rotary Club** with **DIGIT**; **Macquarie Park with Carols on the Common** and the eFun Run; Ryde also with the eFun Run: with Chatswood/Roseville in raising funds through Christmas Puddings, the proceeds going to the "Books in Homes "project at Moree East Public School; Hunters Hill and the Youth sub committees in District 9685.

Thank you to **AG Julie Thorp**, for encouraging our collaborations and holding the Presidents' meetings at The Ranch, for fellowship and the swapping of useful ideas.

The Club held a **"Thank You "breakfast** in July for sponsors of the **2023 eFun Run at Dunmore Lang College**. It is vital that we have support for this major fundraiser from the businesses in our community, and we thank our sponsors very much for their support.

Planning started for **2024 eFun Run** early in the year, and I wish to thank **Pam Wood** for all her hard work in organising this event. Pam invited other Clubs in our cluster to join with us, and it was a great way to learn from each other and raise much needed funds for youth mental health.



We have just concluded this event, with a greater emphasis on collaboration between **our Club**, **Macquarie Park, and Ryde Rotary Clubs**. **The Lifespan Health and Wellbeing Research Centre** (previously known as the Centre for Emotional Health) **at Macquarie University**, came onboard with events at the University this year, and had loads of fun helping us to help them with much needed funds for families to be able to attend counselling sessions at their vital centre. The annual **Carols on the Common** is a joint project, with the **Rotary Club of Macquarie Park.** Thank you to **Joint Presidents Roseanna Gallo OAM, and Lydia Scuglia**, and **the Macquarie Park members**, for bringing your skills to the table. It's a huge undertaking with many hours of planning. Last Christmas saw the biggest crowd in attendance with the whole community enjoyed themselves.

In October, we hosted a breakfast and **presentation of donations to the local schools.** Each Principal or Assistant Principal attended and told us what the funds would be used for. It was very interesting to discover the many issues facing each school.

As Youth Exchange Counsellor, I welcomed Luis Alonso Indiano, Currito, from Spain, on behalf of our Club. Luis arrived on 22 July 2023, and we now have another son! Thank you to the four host families Robert and Sharon Sullivan, Cath and Andrew Colville, Maria and Everard Vaz and Barry Starr. They have taken him under their wings and made his cultural exchange such fun. He will be leaving at the end of June and we will miss him so very much.

Kazuma Calder and Nathan Young, took part in the summer RYPEN program. The Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment (RYPEN) is run over a weekend, and develops leadership skills, and deeper thinking of self, for Year 10 students. There is Summer and Winter RYPEN programs held every year. We will be sponsoring Winter RYPEN students again in June 2024.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) and is open to people who have been out of school for at least 12 months, aged between 18 and 25 years old. Our 2024 RYLARANS are Aiden Sauvano and Jane Suh, who work for Bunnings Gladesville.

Our Fundraising continued in earnest, with the **Gladesville Bunnings BBQs** being ably organised by **Garry Maloney**. I think that we have quite the reputation now, in efficiency and friendliness. We also have fun, with **Rob Wilkinson** providing the music for us all to groove along to. Thank you also to **Sandeep Rathi** for the yoga stretch sessions. Well done team.

Our **Trivia night team** organised wonderful evening of friendship and companionship in February. I think my brain still is recovering from the questions designed to separate the chalk from the cheese. Thank you to **Trivia Master, Brian Bailey** and the team for a very successful night. Thanks also to **Reverend John Chappell** for the use of his hall and amenities. Funds raised from the Trivia night will go towards our **youth programs and the Books in Homes Project.**

Our Club continues to support the **Riding for the Disabled at Marsfield.** Some of our members also personally sponsor a student to attend therapy sessions. Pete and I have been doing this for a few years now, and I encourage all of you to consider this project.

The Tree of Joy at Cox's Road Mall again spreads a lot of cheer in our community thanks to Pam Wood and her group of helpers. A huge number of gifts were collected and distributed. Special thanks to Bendigo Bank North Ryde who is a major supporter of this activity.

Some of our members attended the **Mental Health Training Course in November 2023.** Under the expert teachings of **Michele Ellery.** It was such a rewarding training course. Michele is also **Nominee for District Governor for 2025-26.** We congratulate her for her nomination.

In August, Pete and I attended the **Dunmore Lang College 2023 scholarship breakfast**. A wonderful morning to meet and greet the recipients of the scholarships. Our club provides a scholarship to a student to support them in their chosen field of study for the year.

Some members of our club also attended the principal's cocktail afternoon with **Principal Alasdair Murrie-West**. A great afternoon of networking. What a wonderful scholastic group Alasdair Murrie-West leads. So inspiring.

During the week of **12-17 May 2024**, **David Martin, and Peter Mason**, organised for 8 students to come to Sydney. Four from Forbes and four from Inverell. During the week, the students are exposed to many aspects of **careers in IT**. The group visit companies, including **Google**, **Oracle**, **Microsoft**, **Cisco**, **IBM**, **Coles Distribution centre**, **the Department of Home Affairs**, **University of Technology**, **Macquarie University and Cochlear**. The students get to experience Robotics, Programming, and functionality within these companies. At Macquarie University, the students met a young lady, four years their senior, who came from Tamworth. They heard how she coped with her new life in a big city and her insights into Uni life.

Under the guidance and leadership of **District Governor Christine Owen**, our Club supported her main focus for action, *Saying NO to domestic violence and Yes to action against violence*.

Marches and awareness campaigns have been this year's achievement. It has been wonderful to be involved, and to now see the Federal and State Governments taking notice and supporting this initiative to wipe out this scourge. **DG Elect Niranjan Deodhar** has vowed to carry this initiative forward.

Community Service encourages every Rotarian to find ways to improve the quality of life for people in their communities and to serve the public interest.

- Encouraging and fostering the ideal of service to the personal, business and community life of every Rotarian.
- Opportunities for every Rotarian to exemplify "Service Above Self".
- A chance to respond to the needs of the local community.

The club has continued to have a busy year with our Community Service projects.

The regular **bi-monthly BBQ's at Bunnings Gladesville** have been a great fundraising activity for the club. These BBQ's have provided a fundraising stream for club projects, as well as raising our profile in the community. We have a team of up to 8 or 9 members and friends of the club who help throughout the day and make the day enjoyable for all involved.

We are very appreciative of the ongoing support from **Bunnings Gladesville**, **Bush's Meats Gladesville**, **Ritchies IGA**, **Cox's Road Fruit Market and Kwik Kopy North Ryde**.

Our thanks also to **Em Serrao and Ron Marton** for their assistance in designing the signage for the Tree of Joy and the BBQ's respectively.

The Club continued to provide a donation of **\$500 to each of the 6 local Primary schools and \$1000 to Ryde Secondary College** to support programs for the students. We hosted four principals and teacher representatives at a breakfast meeting at Dunmore Lang College in October. This was a great opportunity to hear about what is happening in the schools and how these donations are used to support specific programs.



We provide an **annual scholarship of \$1000** to a selected student from **Dunmore Lang College** to help cover their educational expenses for the year. We also continue our sponsorship of a student through **the Smith Family Learning for Life Program**. This year we also provided a \$200 sponsorship for the **City of Ryde Eisteddfod**.

We continued to work with the **Rotary Club of Macquarie Park** on planning the Carols on the Common. This year, the Carols were held at **North Ryde Common on Sunday 17 December** along with the much-anticipated fireworks finale. The event was well supported and appreciated by the community with one of the best crowds in attendance yet.

The annual Carols on the Common are supported and

sponsored by local community members, groups and businesses, the City of Ryde Council and State and Federal Members of Parliament. **Stephen Sim** was, once again, MC for the event and **Roseanna Gallo OAM** organised and lead the performances, as well as being Chairperson for the committee.

This year each club raised **\$11864** to go towards our **annual giving programs** through the Carols. From total funds raised **\$500 each** was donated to **St John's Ambulance, Ryde SES, Warringah Headquarters SES and East Ryde Scout** group. Funds raised from the bucket collection went to **CCA NSW Community Hub**, to support victims of domestic violence.



Throughout **November and December**, the Rotary Club of North Ryde sets up the **Tree of Joy at Cox's Road Mall**. Our thanks to **Cox's Road Mall** for the continued support of the **Tree of Joy** and to **Bendigo Bank North Ryde** for the sponsorship of \$1000 which helped provide gifts for residents of **Macquarie Hospital and Baptist Care Aged Care Homes**.

Gifts from the Tree of Joy were donated to North Ryde Community Aid-Presbyterian Aged Care, CCA Community Hub, St Vincent De Paul, Macquarie Hospital and Baptist Care Aged Care Homes at Marsfield.



The North Ryde community was again, very generous with their donations with approximately **2000 gifts** donated. **Reverend John Chappell** provided storage at St John's Anglican Church Hall as gifts came in and were collected. Businesses in the Mall also provided support for the Tree of Joy including **Ritchies IGA Supa Market, North Ryde Pharmacy and Café SaBu.**

We continued the **Christmas pudding drive** which was undertaken with **Chatswood/Roseville, Wahroonga, Pennant Hills and Turramurra Rotary Clubs** to raise funds for a literacy program called **"Books in Homes" for Moree East Public School.**

Nearly 90% of the students at the school come from the local Aboriginal community. The program has had a profound positive effect on the literacy skills of the students. The program provides "...quality books-of-choice to children living in remote, disadvantaged and low socio-economic circumstances, ensuring crucial early literacy engagement and the development of reading skills needed for lifelong achievement." **The Rotary Clubs in Moree** are our local representatives.

Some of our members joined other local community group in the **Walk against Domestic Violence held** on **Thursday 23 November 2023.** The aim of this walk was to draw attention to the need to stop domestic violence in the world and give a sense of hope for the victims. We also had members join in the **District 9685 Walk Against Domestic Violence** held at Terrigal prior to the District Conference in March. This walk raised \$2000 to go towards support for victims of domestic violence.

Five of our members and one member from Macquarie Park Rotary Club participated in the **Mental Health First Aid Training** over the **weekend of the 4-5 November at Epping.** The course was run by **District Governor Nominee Designate, Michele Ellery.**

We congratulated club members **Mandy Van and Rob Wilkinson** for their nominations in the **City of Ryde Australia Day Citizen of the Year** awards. Rob was awarded a local **Community Hero** award at the presentation event.



The North Ryde eFun Run for Youth Mental Health was virtual, once again, this year. The eFun Run was held in partnership with the Rotary Clubs of Macquarie Park and Ryde and Macquarie University's Lifespan Health and Wellbeing Research Centre. It was held over a week from 29 April until 5 May 2024

This year the eFun Run raised **approximately \$14 000** through direct sponsorship of participants by their friends, families and colleagues, as well as corporate sponsorship from **Bendigo Bank North Ryde and North Ryde RSL. Bunnings Gladesville** once again provided a **\$250 voucher** as a prize for the entrant who raised the most money individually.

Funds will be distributed between Australian Rotary Health and Macquarie University Lifespan Health and Wellbeing Research Centre's Cool Kids Program.

Whilst we have a small membership, our club has worked hard to have a strong and positive profile in the local community and continue to support the community throughout the year.



The Club continued with our support for **Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC) this** year with ROMAC commencing operations again after COVID 19 affecting this valuable program. This year our club **donated \$2000 to ROMAC** as part of our annual giving.

We have always had a strong interest in helping countries, including our own, that have been engulfed in natural disasters or wars. This year we have been able to donate **\$2000 for two ShelterBoxes.**

The ShelterBox is sent to areas where homes have been destroyed, by natural disaster or war and contains a tent for up to 10 people, all the equipment a family would need to cook and purify water, and books and pencils etc for children.





Each year, our Club also supports **Rotary's End Polio Campaign** through an annual donation to **the Rotary Foundation.** This year we have contributed \$3004 to the Foundation through the Centurion program.
