Last Weeks Speaker

Dr Adrienne Leahy spoke to us on the subject of posture and the relationship between good health and good posture. Poor posture, indicated by round shoulders, a sloppy stomach and a bent neck results in a lack of energy, poor balance, sleep loss and even memory problems. This helps to bring on arthritis, sciatica and other causes of back and leg pains.

In this modern age of computers, posture faults are exacerbated by sitting for long periods putting the wrong strains on the body. A common fault is Techs Neck; where the computer operator slumps over his machine. The correct way is to have your knees below your hips, your elbows at ninety degrees and your eyes level with the top of the screen. Standing up every twenty minutes or so and just moving round the room for a few minutes will help the situation.

Adrienne explained that a chiropractor is trained to remedy underlying and longstanding problems in the body; as opposed to a physiotherapist who solves local is-

sues in the muscles rather than the bones.
