This Tuesday, April 25, will mark the 101st year of ANZAC Day commemorations, with thousands of people participating in official services and marches across the country.

Anzac Day goes beyond the anniversary of the landing on Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day on which we remember all Australians who served and died in war and on operational service.

The spirit of Anzac, with its qualities of courage, mateship, and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of national identity.





Last Weeks Speakers

The two pupils we sponsored to the National Youth Science Forum, at the Australian national University in Canberra, spoke to us on their experiences at the Forum in January this year.

Firstly Alana Huang from North Sydney Girls High described her twelve days spent in residence at the ANU campus. About 300 pupils, all about to start year twelve, attended and were broken into groups representing the many aspects of science: chemistry, physics, medicine, food technology, computer science and several others. Rotary clubs nominate pupils who go through a selection process, with commercial sponsors and participant's families contributing to the costs. Alana chose chemistry and spoke enthusiastically of the knowledge she gained from the practical laboratory sessions, workshops and lectures which kept all the pupils busy all day. The social interaction within the group and the opportunity to see around Canberra augmented the formal activities and altogether the 12 days were an unforgettable experience.

Harriet Easterbrook from Fort Street High at Petersham, spoke of her participation in the Physics group describing her visits to Mt Stromlo Observatory, the Deep Space Radio Telescope at Tidbinbilla, the discussions on Supernovas and Nanoscience and the visit to the ANU Super Computer as highlights of her time at the ANU.

Both girls expressed their appreciation to the Club for its support of the programme and to Silvio Gmur in particular and both described the Forum as a wonderful opportunity to learn more about their favourite subject.
