## INTRODUCING OUR SPEAKER FOR JUNE 15, 2017, MR TIM HOWARD, DESTINY RESCUE AUSTRALIA

This week we will hear from Tim Howard of Destiny Rescue Australia, an International, not-for profit organization dedicated to rescuing, restoring & reintegrating children who have been lured, sold or trafficked into sexual exploitation.

Destiny Rescue currently runs its programs in six counties:

Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, India, the Philippines &

Dominican Republic.

Additionally, there are 3 funding countries assisting the organization: USA, Australia and New Zealand.

Since its inception in 2011 over 2000 children have been rescued by Destiny Rescue with the youngest being a four-year-old child!

Children and young adults in the care of Destiny Rescue are given medical, physical and psychological support to help them overcome their traumatic pasts.

Children get the chance to be children again in a safe and loving home environment. Young adults are offered education and vocational training, to prepare them for a successful & sustainable reintegration into mainstream society.

The organization relies on the generous support of individuals, churches, businesses, schools and community groups.

## Last Weeks Guest Speaker


Peter Watson was very different to our normal speaker. A New Zealander, living in Sydney, Peter decided to run from Cape Reinga at the northern tip of the North Island

of New Zealand at the other end of the South Island. To make it even harder he had no back-up support and carried all his food and equipment with him. The journey eventually took 59 days to complete, meaning he ran the equivalent of 57 marathons in the 2405 kilometre total distance. Normally he slept rough, but sometimes found a welcoming home en route. Besides wearing out 6 pairs of running shoes and suffering extreme pain in the legs for the first few weeks, Peter soldiered on without any cooking gear. As expected he found the first few days the hardest and when he had overcome the leg pains and huge blisters, he settled down. Being summer, the weather was reasonable and daylight longer, which helped also. As he carried only

one spare set of clothes, it was fortunate that he was alone during the many lonely days. He must have been ready to quit on many occasions but explained how his philosophy of pressing kept him going.

Peter's run raised almost \$10,000 for charity and he now endeavours to raise more funds by speaking on his magnificent achievement. We all wish him well, hopefully raising funds will be easier than running 2400 kilometres.


# **CLUB CHANGEOVER DINNER**

'Moral: Old men may walk slow, but they can still think fast.


