## LAST WEEKS SPEAKER: PP DENIS BOOTH. “THE RISE AND FALL OF THE BANK MANAGER”

We were privileged to hear “first hand” from PP Denis Booth on his remarkable 45 years in the banking industry in Sydney with the National Bank of Australia.

His address to the club was an innovative interview style presentation with interviewer Rotarian Jiji Lee.

Denis began his banking career in North Sydney at the ripe young age of 15 years in the position of Junior Clerk. After 18 months in this position he was promoted to a Sydney City branch and from where; over time he had no less than an astonishing 36 promotions. His first Branch Manager’s position was in 1978 in Forestville and we would say that Denis never looked back. Over the years he moved from the City to North Sydney and back, including the opening of a commercial branch at North Point in North Sydney. He shared with us the evolution of the bank managers role over time. Not too many years ago we knew the bank manager personally who attended to our financials requirements for loans, mortgages and the like. Computerization has replaced the personal touch and we are the poorer for it.

Denis recounted many compelling personal experiences, including the time his branch at City Tatts was robbed!
