Look forward to seeing you on Thursday when we will probably be enjoying either Steak and Veges or Fish and Chips

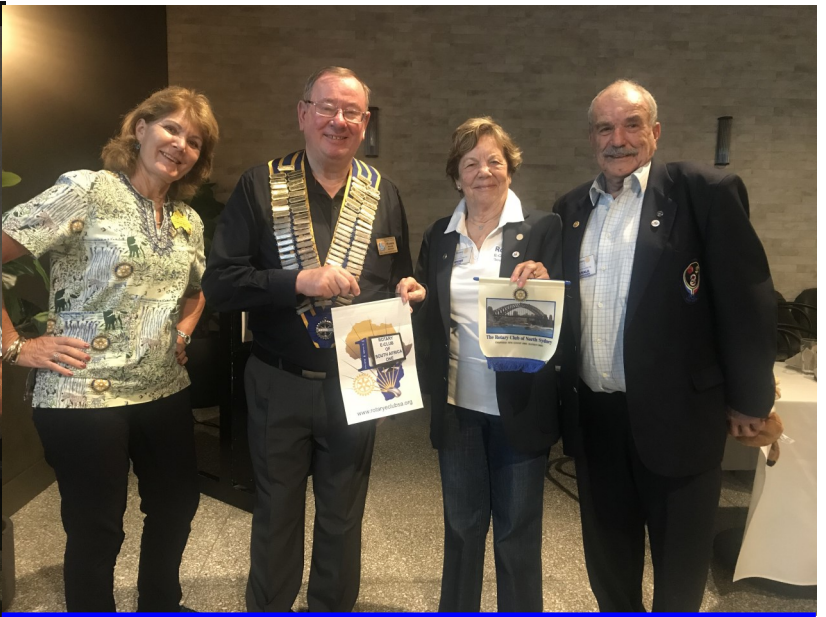

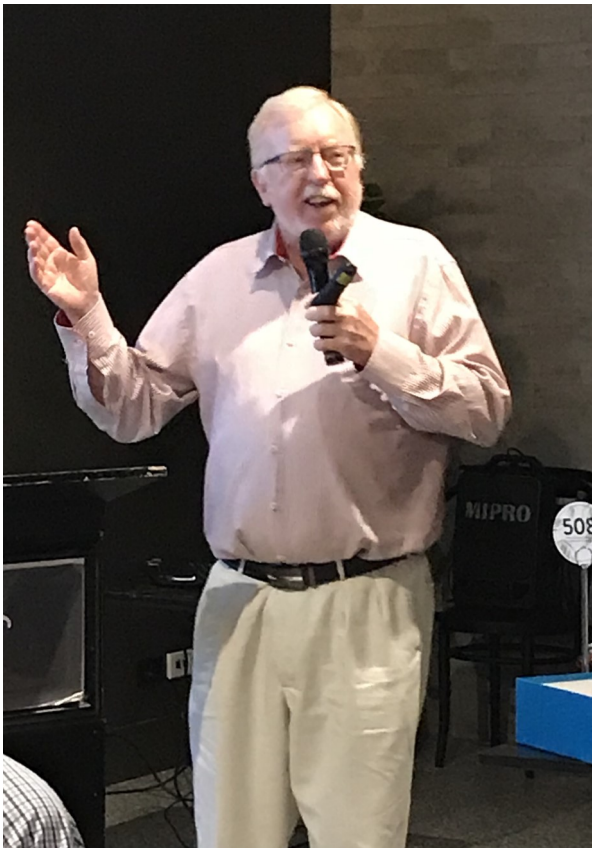
