Guest Speaker from Last Meeting 7th February

Jay Allen from the Melanoma Institute spoke to us about Melanomas, firstly explaining how you can identify such a cancer on your skin from other skin conditions by its unevenness and changing colour. He emphasised the need at all times in the sun to use proper sunscreen, wear long sleeved shirts, a sun hat and sun glasses and always sit under an umbrella at the beach, especially during the danger period between 11am and 2pm. He explained that Melanomas can appear many years after appearing in the sun, that your skin will affect your propensity for catching the condition.

Jay explained that he was a Melanoma victim and now works for the Institute lecturing the public on ways to prevent getting the cancer. He has already undertaken a marathon walk in which he raised about \$260,000 for the cause. In March he is about to commence a second walk, this time from Adelaide to Sydney via Melbourne in which he hopes to raise \$350,000. He hopes to be met in Sydney on 19 May by a crowd including the State Governor.



Jay explained that most funds come from private donations, with little from Government sources, which was disappointing.

His speak was very well received and will I am sure the project be considered when our benevolent funds are ascribed.
