### CONGRATUALTIONS ON RAISING \$606,000! TARGET - NO DEATHS FROM MELANOMA


Today we welcomed guest speaker Jay Allen from the Melanoma Institute of Australia. Jay, a survivor of Melanoma shared with us his incredible journey of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Melanoma March from Adelaide to Sydney. This March commenced on March 31, took over 50 days, walking a distance of 2,000 Klm. Every day it was up at 6.00am and walking until approx. 7pm every evening, averaging 48 klm per day. The March consisted of 6 committee volunteers and 4 vehicles led by Jay.

As a nation of sun worshippers, we easily forget that Melanoma is considered Australia's National disease. A reminder to keep your kids safe.

The March not only raises valuable funds that are necessary for research and we hope eventually a Cure for Melanoma, but the March also provided an opportunity for those who Melanoma has touched personally or touched a member of their family to join the walk at any stage and any length of time. While walking, participants had the opportunity to share their story of survival and recovery and/or their story of grief. This incredible journey gave all participants the opportunity to connect with others and become a support to each other while participating in such a worthy cause. Jay showed us lots of photos given to him on his walk. These photos of victims of Melanoma provided the motivation to keep marching when blisters upon blisters and fatigue looked like they were winning. A total of 340 people participated in the march at varying locations which concluded on May 19<sup>th</sup>.

The Rotary Club of North Sydney is proud to have made a donation of \$5,000 to this worthy cause and this donation was accompanied by a further generous donation by one of our Club members who is a survivor.

### Last weeks Guest Speaker 11th July.

Our speaker last week was Jay Allen from the Melanoma Institute, describing his walk from Adelaide to Sydney earlier this year. This is the third of Jay's walks to raise awareness and funds for the prevention of Melanoma. Australia, with it's climate and proximity to the sea, has the world's most prevalent melanoma sufferers and needs all the support it can get. Jay, a past sufferer from Melanoma has so far completed three marathon walks, previously walking from Sydney to Melbourne and Sydney to Brisbane. His route this time, was not direct, as he passed through Bordertown, Horsham, Ballarat, Melbourne, Yarrawonga, Canberra and Bateman's Bay before reaching Sydney. Commencing on the 30<sup>th</sup> of March, this year, Jay finished on the 19<sup>th</sup> of May, raising the amazing amount of \$606.000 for the Institute. So far in the three walks, Jay has earned over \$1,000,000 for this very worthy cause.

The weather was mainly kind, having only one or two wet days during the 50 en route, which allowed Jay to make good time alongside his five fellow walkers who took turns to join him on the road. Three Toyota vehicles were donated to ferry the team, a big factor in making the trip such a success. Jay described the many generous people he met on the road including a fellow sufferer near Yarrawonga, his football idol Jarryd Roughhead in Melbourne and the Melanoma surgeons at the Peter Mc Callum Institute in Melbourne. His food intake included up to 8 bananas and 2 to 3 litres of water each day and he mentioned the problems he had with blisters, which seemed a natural hazard. He closed with a video of the trip and was grateful to receive cheques for \$6,000 from the club and Geoff Pritchard.

An inspiring lecture, but I was happy to watch the story unfold in a comfortable chair.

We all know we need to raise funds to meet our goals to support our community via worthwhile projects that make the world a better place. It's important to remember we can achieve this task and still have fun!

### Ross & Jenny's trip to Scone – what fun they had!

As you would all be aware from our Annual Report the Market money was divided equally this year between the Melanoma Foundation and help for the farmers. (Both receiving \$5,000). During our 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebrations we also raised money also for Buy a Bale and this was distributed through this organisation through the Benevolent Fund.

It was suggested that I should contact Belltrees one of the largest properties in the Hunter at Scone who are desperate for help. 'Belltrees' was acting as a base for farmers in need to come and collect donated hay at no cost – all they had to do was come and collect it! Obviously the owners of this property were well aware of those in need.

I purchased \$5,000 worth of hay directly from the supplier to be delivered to 'Belltrees'. This was organised and I was invited up to the property to see first hand the bare creeks, all the properties with not a blade of grass and to hear the farmers distressed calls for help. Some had just sold up – there were paddocks and only breeding cattle left. All horses were out on agistment and all other cattle had been sent to the abattoirs. I naturally asked Ross if he would like to come as we were the major fund raisers. They invited us to their monthly farmers dinner at the "Gundy Pub" on the Friday night!



We left last Friday and it was pelting down with rain most of the way – we thought we were going to bring the farmers 'good luck' with rain – but not true it stopped about 40 KLMS out of town. Looked threatening all day – but not a drop.

Earlier we had been invited to spend the afternoon on a site seeing trip around 'Belltrees' as soon as we arrived. It was the best afternoon I can remember for so long – very sad but Anto the owner gave us a great time. He immediately realised he had a farmer in the making with Ross on board and decided to give him

a few 'farming lessons'! He took us out in 'his truck' and as the creeks were all dry as a bone he

decided to scare the hell out of us by going at great knots down into the dry bed and up the other side – hair raising to say the least. He had previously loaded a bale of hay on the ute and tried to get Ross to push it towards the cattle – a futile exercise! He also taught Ross how to 'call the cattle' to notify them that food had arrived. He offered to let Ross 'crack the whip', test the branding irons out etc. etc.

We had a most welcome visit to, a pub on the way back to our 'digs' and then a quick change and a half an hour drive back to the Gundy Pub for Dinner.



This was another very interesting time – great country meal, speeches about 'horse' problems, etc. The owner of 'Belltrees' thanked North Sydney Rotary for their donation – great applause – another few drinks then back to Scone to sleep.

A magic 36 hours and I will be looking forward to going again when we have raised enough money to justify being invited again. I enjoyed every second of it as I am sure Ross did also.

Ross and I could talk about it for ages!.


