The program consists of 6 lessons for age 9-12 years with the vision of teaching the participants techniques to increase confidence, build self-esteem and develop a toolkit to use when faced with future challenges. The techniques taught are all focused on guiding our younger generations to be our future leaders and to reach their full potential in life.

The Rotary Club of North Sydney has sponsored an application with Jacqui for a Community Project made possible by the NSW Government utilising the NSW Generation Fund. Our Application has applied for funding to deliver the programme to 500 students within our electorate. If successful we will receive a Grant of \$25,000 and this project will come to life.

From many applications received, our Project was successful in reaching the final stage – the public vote. Voting is open to the public from July 15 to August 15. The projects with the most votes receive the available Grants.

### How to vote

Log onto your MyServiceNSW Account and provide your Medicare card details and your residential address.

Using your MyServiceNSW Account and Medicare card ensures each person can only vote once.

By entering your residential address your vote verifies you are in the applicable electorate and your Medicare card details verifies you are over the age of 16.

If you live in the Willoughby electorate in any one of the following suburbs you should be eligible to vote: Artarmon, Cammeray, Castlecrag, Castle Cove, Crows Nest, Chatswood, Chatswood West, Lane Cove North, Middle Cove, Naremburn, Neutral Bay, Northbridge, North Cremorne, North Sydney, Roseville, St Leonards and Willoughby.

Please ask all your friends and family to vote for us.

It was a pleasure to attend a recent meeting of members of Rotaract North Sydney. The purpose of my visit was to thank them for their particiaption and present a Certificate in recognition of their participation in the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal Fund raising day which was held the last Sunday in May.



### **Guest Speaker from 18th July**

David Gordon, from the organisation TAD, standing for Technical Aids for the Disabled,

spoke to us on the many aids that his group of talented designers and builders have provided over the years to help the less fortunate amongst us, make life more easy.

David split the range of appliances into three categories, the first being "Freedom Wheels" which are various adaptations of bicycles to allow more freedom, mobility and exercise for those unable to ride a normal bike. A great slide showing a disabled small boy hugging the Governor-General, Sir Peter Cosgrove on being given a specially adapted bike was brilliant in its spontaneity. The various bikes are designed to grow with the owner and still provide safe riding. Tricycles and even reclining bicycles were also shown as available.

The second category was "Adaptable Solutions" where various everyday functions could be adapted to help the disabled. Walkers and bath seats with special attachments solved the problem. The third category was "Unique Solutions" where the technical expertise and ingenuity of the designers really came to the fore. Pram locks and supports, baby cot assists, vehicle entry assists and even a device to allow a person with limited mobility to put on their own shoes and socks were illustrated.

All these solutions show what can be done by people who think about their less fortunate neighbours and it would be excellent if the availability of these one-off devices could be more generally publicised and given more support now we have the NDIS in place. Thank you David for showing what can be done by the caring for the needy
