#### How to vote

Log onto your MyServiceNSW Account and provide your Medicare card details and your residential address.

Using your MyServiceNSW Account and Medicare card ensures each person can only vote once.

By entering your residential address your vote verifies you are in the applicable electorate and your Medicare card details verifies you are over the age of 16.

If you live in the Willoughby electorate in any one of the following suburbs you should be eligible to vote: Artarmon, Cammeray, Castlecrag, Castle Cove, Crows Nest, Chatswood, Chatswood West, Lane Cove North, Middle Cove, Naremburn, Neutral Bay, Northbridge, North Cremorne, North Sydney, Roseville, St Leonards and Willoughby.

Please ask all your friends and family to vote for us.

It was noted and discussed that reminder notices are not sent out to Members who wish to contribute and support the Rotary Foundation Centurion Plan.



# International Service: Water Catchment System for Kirantos Sunshine School Project, Kenya

This year, the International team is partnering with BeyondWater to build a much-needed Water Catchment System for the Kirantos Sunshine School in Kenya.

With dry seasons in Kenya lasting up to 8 months a year, the current 5,000L tank at the school only lasts the staff and its 200 students around two months. When they run out, the nearest water source is a dirty pond 2 km away.

Our aim is to raise funds for BeyondWater to use local workers to install two 10,000L water tanks, and a guttering system for water catchment.

To that end, we are very happy to announce that our <u>District Grant application for the Water Catchment System Project has been approved!</u> Now we just have the raise the funds to match it!

BeyondWater, established in 2007, is a not-for-profit organisation whose focus is ensuring access to safe, clean drinking water and sanitation facilities across communities in east Africa. 
Congratulations to Lily Lee who has received and has been presented with The Paul Harris Sapphire Pin Award in recognition of Lily's support to The Rotary Foundation.


