REPORT FOR OUR OUTWARD EXCHANGE STUDENT - HENRY MORGAN IN BELGIUM

I am having a wonderful time in Belgium!

I live with my host mother Esther , Dad Steve and little sister Jade. My host brother Ferre is in Australia being hosted by the Windsor club.

I have done a lot of exciting activities since I have been here including skiing in a hug indoor ski centre (so fun), virtual reality gaming and lots of fun board games including the traditional Belgium that looks a bit like a cross between shuffle board and backgammon.

I have also done a lot of travelling. I have gone to Brussels (three times), Antwerp, Turnhout, Leuven, Liege, Heselt and a lot of other smaller villages.



Brussels was amazing I went with some other exchange students and there we went to the Grand Plaza and then to a Waffle House, the waffles and the chocolate are so good, but on assessment I think the waffles are better in Brussels and the chocolate is better in Antwerp although it is a pretty close thing.



I am enjoying school. I go to SJCA (translates to St Josephs College). To get to school I ride my bike and then park at the bus stop and catch the bus. I have made a lot of friends. My subjects include Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Maths, History and English. My best subject is of course English but a close second is Physics and I got 15/20 in my last exam. One interesting difference about the school is that in Belgium is we have an indoor eating room

(I was going to say comfortable room but it is a series of wooden benches). When

there was a 100 days remaining of school the school through a special party - that was fun! This was for the Year 6 (which are our Year 12s) and the Year 6s called up each of the teachers and they had to do a spelling test in front of everyone. It was pretty funny.

So all is going well. Some of my favourite things about Belgium are: garlan, which is a garlic and cheese dip for crackers, the chocolates, waffles - sorry this is sounding very food centric. I also



love historic buildings and general atmosphere in every village and town. There are beautiful old churches, winding paths and plazas. I am learning a lot of new factsDid you know that Antwerp is the world centre for the diamond industry? But overall I am thoroughly enjoying my experience here. My host family is lovely, I have made friends at school and am really looking to a trip to Italy in early April. I am so grateful for this fantastic opportunity of a life time. I pinch myself sometimes to remind me it is not a dream.

The Purple House story begins with some magnificent paintings...

Thirty years ago, Pintupi people from the Western Desert of Central Australia began leaving their country and families to seek treatment for end-stage renal failure in Alice Springs or Darwin. Far from home, they suffered great loneliness and hardship, and weren't around to pass on cultural knowledge in their communities.

So they decided to do something about it.

In 2000 Papunya Tula artists from Walungurru and Kiwirrikurra developed four extraordinary collaborative paintings which were auctioned at the Art Gallery of New South Wales on 11 November 2000, which along with a series of other work, raised over \$1 million. That money started the Western Desert Nganampa Walytja Palyantjaku Tjutaku Aboriginal Corporation, now called Purple House, which developed a new model of care based around family, country and compassion.

Run from its headquarters in a suburban house in Alice Springs, <u>Purple House's mission</u> is 'Making all our families well'. Flexibility and cultural safety is at the centre of everything we do. It's the 'Purple House way'.
