## Guest Speakers Report Meeting 9th July.

Dr Will Davies noted historian, author and one of Australia's leading documentary film makers returned to our club to discuss with us a little known fact about WWI – THE FORGOTTEN, the 250,000 Chinese labourers known as the CLC who were sent to France and England to help clean up the war zones of unexploded munitions and

assist in the cleaning up of the rubble left by the battles and load and unload boats and trains during the final times of the war. Thousands of them died from European diseases that they had never been exposed to and many died while clearing mines.

They came to Europe via Canada, arriving in Vancouver then travelling by train for 5 days and nights across Canada to depart from Halifax to France and England.

Dr Will also discussed our Chinese Australian ANZACS who distinguished themselves at Gallipoli and the Somme including sniper Private 'Billy' Sing DCM who at Gallipoli is credited of shooting over 200 Turkish soldiers. The 3 Langtip brothers, Henry, Leslie and Bertie to name just a few.

After the meeting an old school friend of mine, a past Rotarian for the Sydney Club, Vic Edwards who lectures at UNSW in Chinese history and Lily Lee led a brief discussion on today's China as a result of their experiences with the west during the 19<sup>th</sup> Century.

## A Chat with Geoff Pritchard OAM

#### 1. Where did you study to become a Pharmacist Geoff?

I studied at Sydney University and graduated in 1965 and then went to London for further study, returning to Sydney in 1967.

#### 2. When did you join Rotary?

I joined the Rotary Club of Newtown in 1981 which then merged with RC of West Sydney to become the RC of Sydney Inner West in 1995. I was President three times!

#### 3. Where did you grow up? (I might be getting older but I refuse to grow up).

In Bass Hill and I went to Homebush Boys High School. I'm a westie from way back. I don't remember going across the harbour bridge until I was about 25.

#### 4. What Rotary activities have you been associated with?

When I was younger I was involved in many fundraising activities and I was on the selection committee to elect District Governors including the first two lady DGs. From 1995 Joan and I have been Counsellors for Rotary Ambassadorial Scholars. We have kept in touch with most of them and many have become leaders in their various countries. It was very pleasing to have been involved.

#### 5. How do you think Rotary is viewed in the community today?

Well, years back we were more social and involved in many activities when clubs were 3 or 4 times the size they are now. Of course now that I am older and living much of the time in the country it's not as easy to participate. I believe that mentoring is a wonderful way to support individuals and I would like to see more of this in today's Rotary.

#### 6. What is one thing that has enhanced our lives today ?

Well that has to be technology. Communication is so much easier and important in our lives and bringing women into Rotary.

#### 7. What changes in Rotary have you liked?

Women in Rotary was a great step forward. There have been some excellent women Presidents and District Governors.

#### 8. Looking back what are a few things that you have really enjoyed with Rotary?

The internationality of Rotary, particularly through my involvement with Ambassadorial Scholars. I have made up in Rotary Clubs all around the world and have had many overseas Rotarians and/or their families stay with us here in Sydney.

Being co-opted into the RC of Cap Martin-Rocquebrune during the years we were living on and off in Monaco.

And, being involved with a great group of members at North Sydney who may be fairly quiet but are always willing to lend a hand.

#### 9. What other activities have you been involved in outside of Rotary?

- Working in a drug addiction clinic in West London for 2 years.
- Co-owner of a Rolls Royce and Bentley service centre in Newtown for 3 years.
- Restoration of countless old English sports cars in a large workshop at our house in Kangaroo Point, Sydney, mainly MGs, Healeys, Sunbeam Tiger, Jags, Volvo P1800, etc.
- In 1968 studied real estate courses at the Real Estate Institute and became a licensed real estate agent and auctioneer for about 10 years.
- Created many subdivisions on the NSW south coast.
- In 1978 after the death of Elvis Presley in 1977, and during the renovation of Gracelands, four pharmacists (one of which unfortunately was me) brought the Elvis Presley Museum to Australia and showed it in all the capital cities. (It was a disaster).
- After the introduction of generic drugs in Australia I spent 18 years running continuing education for pharmacists in NSW for the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia. I said I would do it for 6 months after selling my last shop in Newtown.
- Spent 11 years on the Pharmacy Board of NSW, the disciplinary and regulatory body for pharmacists.
- Chairman of the Newtown Chamber of Commerce.
- Licensee of the NSW Rugby League for 5 years manufacturing and importing RL memorabilia from HK and Taiwan.
- Director of the Sydney 2000 Olympics (for which I received my OAM).
- Lived on and off for 7 years in Monaco after the Olympics.
- All this while running pharmacies in Newtown. I was never home.
- Thank you Geoff.. a full life indeed!
