FOCUS ON ROSS WAUGH.

1. WHERE DID YOU GROW UP? TELL US ABOUT YOUR CHILDHOOD.

I was born in the San Wahroonga and started my schooling at Waitara PS followed by Barker College and then an American school year in Beverley Hills California (which I loved) and finally as a boarder at Sydney Grammar School where I graduated in November 1966. Until my mid teens I lived a fairly normal life in the Waitara/ Wahroonga area. In 1967 my father gave me a deposit on a flat in Gordon which still stands today. Unfortunately I didn't live there long as I accepted a job offer in the USA in late 1968 where I stayed for the next 10 years.

2. WHEN DID YOU JOIN ROTARY ?

I joined Rotary in June 1991 sponsored by Bruce McNeilly whom I knew from Radio 2CH and residing in the same apartment block in Crows Nest. Of course this was in the days of Harry Fieldhouse so there was no way of wriggling out of joining. I had a little involvement in Rotary for Radio KIOA in Des Moines Iowa but I knew I was not staying long. When I joined Nth Sydney there were over 100 members and we would all sit at very long tables.

3. WHAT PART OF ROTARY DO YOU ENJOY?

I really enjoy the social side of Rotary. Of course when we had members from all walks of life I found it fascinating participating in conversation I would normally not have the opportunity to do so. I re-united with John Pearce and his remarks to me at the time was that I had improved! I felt certain that he did not remember me from my 2GB days in the late 60's and to this day I can't understand why he said that.

4. WE KNOW YOU LIKE TO TRAVEL. WHAT ARE YOUR FAVOURITE DESTINATIONS?

For many years my extended family have lived in the USA so for a while particularly in the 80's and 90's I have travelled to Los Angeles and New York. My wife at the time was a Flight Attendant with Pan Am so we travelled a lot particularly to UK, Hawaii, NZ and the Pacific Islands.

5. DO YOU HAVE A SPECIAL HOBBY?

Since early childhood I have surprisingly enjoyed philately (stamp collecting) and for many years I have bought and sold stamps, so much that now I have a room full of stamps. I also like listening to pop music especially the 60's and 70's but when disco music arrived I had clearly enough!

6. IS THERE A FUTURE FOR ROTARY?

It is a pity that younger people are not interested in becoming Rotarians. Perhaps they feel that whilst they are happy to help out when needed they don't want to get involved with meetings, rules and regulations that come with being a Rotarian. We have Rotaract but it doesn't seem to flow onto Rotary. Unfortunately I see Rotary fading away completely in time.

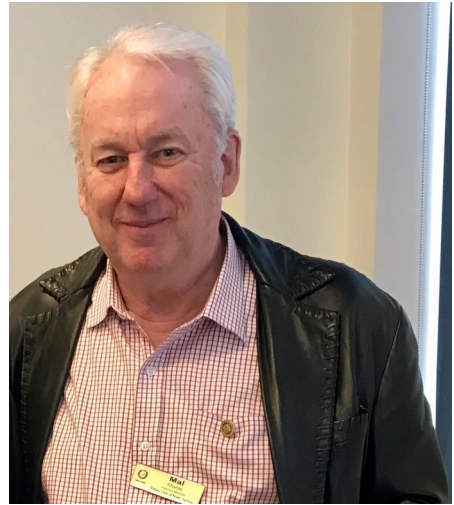


Paul Harris Awards
