Ideas for the Club Vocational Director

This month we take a closer look at the meaning of Ethics and Integrity.

The Code of Ethics states that:

As a Rotarian, I will act with integrity ...

So, what is the difference between Ethics and Integrity?

Ethics may be described as "the branch of philosophy that is concerned with what is morally good or bad, right or wrong." But the word "integrity" also includes an action plan that says, "I hold to these beliefs (my ethics) and I ask you to hold me accountable for these beliefs in everything I say and do". Put another way, it is not enough for me to say "I believe in doing good". I must also say "Judge me on the ways I seek to do good".

Integrity is one of our values – Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity and Leadership

Ethical Decisions - a Framework

The 4 Way Test and Code of Conduct are for most of us very straight forward. It is only when we get into practical situations that we realise that implementation of these standards is not necessarily easy or clear cut; but we still have to make a decision.

The following framework may help you when confronted with an ethical decision.

- IDENTIFY the ethical problem.
- IDENTIFY the stakeholders in the decision.
- OUTLINE possible options.
- STATE commitments you have made.
- CONSIDER the harms and benefits of each option.
- MAKE a decision.
- EVALUATE your course of action.


Something your club could try...
