### Guest Speaker Lily Lee on 29th October

Our own member Lily Lee gave us an excellent talk about THE LONG MARCH which began of the 16th of October 1934 and ended in October 1935 focusing on the 35 women who accompanied Mau Zedong's Communist Party of 86,000 troops and 35 women across China during war against Chaing Kai-shek's Nationalist's which covered some 6,000 miles.

Only 4,000 troops completed the journey which was the longest journey by foot in the history of warfare. Mau's 2nd wife gave birth to a child while on the long march only to have the child taken from her and given to a local family so there would be no delays.

When THE LONG MARCH ended at the end of 1935 the Japanese invaded China and that invasion ended when Japan surrended on 8 September 1945. Four years after the end of the war against the Japanese Mau proclaimed the PEOPLES REPUBLIC OF CHINA.

Thank you Lily for giving us a glimpse of 20th Century history that we were not familiar with!

### Focus on John Taylor

### 1. Tell us about your childhood.

I was born in Sydney and went to South Cronulla primary. Aged 12, the family moved to Adelaide as Dad got a job at a teacher's college there following two years living in New York in 1963 & 64. That was an incredible experience for a 7 year old. Although I was not a good student I managed to get an Economics degree from the University of Adelaide between working and sailing. From Adelaide I moved to the Gold Coast and stockbroking which took me to HK for 9 years where I married Jackie and had Robert and Laura.

### 2. What was your first job and where did it lead you?

I have always wanted to be self employed and found repairing things intuitive. I did a letterbox drop around our neighbourhood and managed to get a job as the handyman for Cottage Homes in Adelaide - an aged care organization. At the same time I bought a run down house in Eastwood for \$5,000 with Dad lending me \$1,000 and going guarantee on the mortgage. It was 1973 and houses were not so expensive relative to incomes. It was a great introduction to the real world and property investment.

### 3. Tell us about your passion for sailing. When did you start?

Just before we moved to Adelaide the family bought a half share in a 12 foot sailing dinghy with our neighbour who also introduced us all to sailing. After moving to Adelaide we joined Brighton and Seacliff Sailing club, bought our own sailing boat and learnt lots very quickly by many capsizers. The school sea scouts also gave me an opportunity to crew on larger boats, leading to my first Sydney Hobart in 1973.

### 4. Why and when did you join Rotary?

1989 in Hong Kong. I wanted (and still do) to give back to the community and the less privileged.

### 5. How do you see Rotary in today's society?

The world has moved on considerably in the way we work, live and communicate since I joined Rotary. I believe there are just a many community minded people now as there was in the 1990's however their engagement is much more dynamic than the traditional Rotary platform.

Here's what I think Rotary should be considering: Much shorter time commitments - project based for weeks or months and flexible time commitments say one or two social gatherings per month and much of the community work done by zoom / emails and web based platforms.

Rotary's image needs modernizing so young professional feel comfortable to join and invite others.
