FOCUS on Elaine Newman ..OUR NEWEST MEMBER.

1. I was born in Birmingham, England. I have two sisters and a brother and was born nine months after my father returned from the war! My father was an eccentric and talented pianist and organist, in the music business. We moved around a lot until I was thirteen, when we moved to Cambridge and settled somewhat. I had a great education there and was able to enjoy all the advantages of being in a University city, until I went to Liverpool to do my teacher training. Here again, it was a great place to be, with the Cavern, Blue Angel and other famous venues of the Liverpool sound , poetry and literature. The college was amazing and we were actually taught how to teach! My three years there, was a very formative and influential period of my life.

I had a very happy childhood. My mother was an angel and my father a great personality!

2. My first job was at St Vincent's Girls Secondary in Victoria, London. I taught Geography, English, Remedial Maths and was head of Physical Education! This was in 1968 and swinging London was the best place to be in the world! I lived ten minutes walk from the school which was run by The Sisters of Charity. It was above the convent and just behind Westminster Cathedral. I learnt so much from the Nuns , the girls and the other staff. It was a wonderful and realistic start to my teaching career.

I have been involved in many aspects of education and taught at all levels in England, New Zealand and Sydney. Helping students with learning and behaviour problems, has been a focus of my teaching life. I was head teacher of a Residential school in Auckland for very disturbed and sometimes violent young people. We had a skilled team of teachers, psychologists and close care supervisors to try and get these at risk and damaged youth, back to school of find them work. It was here that I learnt my communication skills!

Since 2001, I have been involved in many different projects, teaching adults across many areas and work places, being based at Petersham TAFE. I have found these opportunities truly enriching and they have added greatly to my overall teaching experience. In recent years I have been part of a team help-ing young Aboriginal students get an electrical apprenticeship. This has been a privilege and a very fulfilling and worthwhile end to my teaching life.

3. My passion has always been teaching. I have never got up in the morning and not wanted to go to work! I have tried to keep abreast of new research and innovative ways of facilitating learning, especially with students who have learning difficulties and are disadvantaged.

Another passion is my family and now especially my grand children. My husband remains a passion! Finally, I have never stopped loving Rock and Roll Music and dancing.

4. I joined Rotary, to become involved and to help people. As I have recently retired I very much needed to contribute to and support something, and my friend Lily Clarke, a recent president of the North Sydney branch, encouraged me to come to a meeting and that was it!

5. I think I am still learning where our branch fits into the local community. Before I read the Rotary Magazine I was unaware of all the amazing projects, globally, that Rotary is involved in. I think our branch is aware of how important fund raising and communication is, and how we can help our community with initiatives such as the dementia cafe, helping seniors and support services, and also, a local presence through Crowsnest Market. It has been a difficult year with Covid, to see the extent to which our branch ' services ' our local community. There is always discussion, relevant speakers and a recap of what is going on for members to become involved in, at our weekly luncheons. I have been very happy to become part of this branch.
