

MEETING REPORT - 20th MAY, 2019

A club like ours with a small membership does not have many opportunities to host a meeting with in excess of 60 attendees. Last Monday night, for our 44th Pride of Workmanship Awards presentation, we had over 60 in attendance due to the continued strong support for Pride of Workmanship from businesses and organisations in our community. We had nine awardees and, pleasingly, four of those were from new nomination sources, while the other five were from businesses and organisations who have regularly been involved in past years.

We met at Beecroft Bowling Club, having the whole place to ourselves, and the caterer provided table service this time. Tea and coffee being the only serve yourself during the meal. The bowling club provide bar service. Each table hosted one of the awardees and their supporters. Following a period of fellowship, MC Pat Parker called all to order at 7.00pm and opened the meeting with the usual formalities. President Adrian Bell then welcomed the guests - Guest Speaker Alan Lowe and his wife Lee, AG John Fenessy, Betty Graham & Bev Young, John Coulthard, Steve Jackson and his wife, guests of Theo Glockemann, and Allan & Barbara West, guests of David Firth. Adrian then provided a brief outline of the range of projects and activities which our club is engaged in both locally and overseas. He then presented David Raphael, Principal of St Lucy's School, with a cheque for \$3,500, being half the proceeds of our Christmas trailer raffle.

Following dinner, David Firth introduced Rev. Alan Lowe, a past member of our club and a retired minister in the Uniting Church, detailing his career in ministry both in parishes and as a chaplain in the army and the NSW Police Force. Alan gave an excellent talk centred around the theme of the night, Pride of Workmanship, in which he talked about the importance of effective communication which involves listening and input. He spoke about commitment and its importance in achieving a good end result. He also reflected on mistakes the need to own your mistakes and to learn from them so you can move forward. He emphasised that we are human and therefore fallible and not making a mistake is not possible.

The chairman proposed a vote of thanks to Alan and then gave a background to the Pride of Workmanship Awards Program, highlighting the project whereby we supply the award plaques to clubs around Australia and New Zealand and that the project has been embraced by some clubs in USA, Canada, UK and even in Malaysia where Pat was personally involved in the contact with a major club in Kuala Lumpur.

The chairman then invited President Adrian and Alan Lowe to come forward to present the awards to the awardees as their individual citations were read out. Unfortunately the awardee from the Hotel Pennant Hills was unwell and unable to attend so the licencee, Roman Nalywajko, accepted on his behalf. We hope to be able to meet him at one of our future meetings at the hotel. Our resident photographer, Jim Fraser, was on hand to photograph each presentation and then the awardee and award separately. (Jim had been taking photos of each of the tables and various notables during the night.) After the conclusion of the award presentations, Jim was able to assemble the awardees on the stage for a combined photo.

Finally, President Adrian thanked all for attending and we concluded with the singing of the National Anthem. All in attendance seemed to have enjoyed the night evidenced by the continuing fellowship and awardee congratulations the followed for half an hour or more.
