Pat reported on Iceland – volcanoes and lava flows of the past had made for an interesting landscape. He travelled as far north as the Arctic Circle with various stop offs along the way. Iceland gets 100% of its electricity from thermal power and in the past exhausted marine stocks of (was it) herring. Consequently they are very aware of not repeating past acts and the marine stocks are now very important to them. Iceland has a population of only 350,000 – 200,000 live in Reykjavik, however they receive 1.2 million visitors a year, so it is not difficult to see where their economy gets its wealth.



Pat also visited WW1 Battlefield sites. He lauded the new John Monash Centre which was very impressive. But his lasting impression, like many before him, was the horror of war having seen the thousands and thousands of war graves.

Pat name dropped a few other places in passing – a trip from Helsinki to Estonia among them.

In two weeks the Parkers are off to Alaska! It was heartwarming to those present that he has been able to fit in Rotary with his travel schedule, and in response to envious hecklers said the immortal line – "You're a short time living, and a long time dead!" That shut them up.

PJF closed the meeting and reminded members to bring their \$\$ with them next week for the World Worthless Wisdom segment.
