So much has happened in the last 6 months – Bushfires, devastating storms and now Covid19! It is difficult to comprehend the sequence of events and the impact they have had on so many people not just in our community and nation but across the world. In the midst of this however the marvel for me is the resilience of Australians and in particular our community.

How our nation and in particular community cope, and look to help their family and neighbours, is truly a blessing and what makes us "The Lucky Country".

KNC put out a call in March to the community on Facebook for extra volunteers to help us assist many of our clients and community members who would be isolated at home. Alister Henskens MP and his team assisted us to connect with many of the schools in the region and distributed information to parents and students.

The response was remarkable. Hundreds of community members signed up to our 'civilian army' –
especially parents and students from Abbotsleigh, PLC, Ravenswood, Loretto Normanhust, Knox and
Barker. With the help of these volunteers & our regular amazing volunteer team since March 3, KNC has
□ Letterbox dropped every person over 65 in Ku-ring-gai with information as to how to seek assistance
□ Set up a Zero contact Shopping service for people isolated at home
☐ Zero Contact Medication delivery service for people isolated at home
□ Zero contact book delivery service for people isolated at home
□ Converted our Yoga classes, wellness groups, D'Caf's to online programs
☐ Increased our Community Visitors scheme and developed an on-line connection
□ Increased our client catch up calls 1000%

Harris Farm came to us with an offer of free fruit and vegetables for those disadvantaged people in our community. St Ives Shopping Centre offered free space in the Centre - so for the past 6 weeks from Monday to Friday every week at 7.30 am (even on Easter Monday) students and parents from Abbotsleigh, PLC, Ravenswood, Loretto Normanhust, Knox and Barker have joined KNC staff to pack and deliver boxes and parcels of fresh food to isolated older people, local charities such as Hornsby Connect, Fusion, local food pantries, local chuch groups and women shelters. The deliveries have extended beyond our local boundaries to Wayside Chapel, Exodus Foundation and we are assisting thousands of individuals every week. It has been truly a humbling experience to watch our community join us to support our older community members and those less vulnerable in our communities.

Our new volunteers have never queried a single request we have made to drive, shop, collect for the community.

The KNC team, Councils, St Ives Shopping Centre and our politicians have all worked to help us provide support for our community. It has been such a privilege to work side by side with all of you during this time.
