

MEETING REPORT - 10th JUNE, 2020

What a delight it was to at last be able to meet face to face! Although a number of us had met individually on occasions during the lockdown, as well as meeting on Zoom, nothing beats being able to sit down as a club and exchange pleasantries, ideas, and a few humorous asides. So it was that 10 members plus our erstwhile Rotaractor Jason Terry, gathered last Wednesday in the Vicar Room at the golf club which had been carefully prepared for our return.

President Jim opened the meeting in the usual way, welcoming Jason, and a time of fellowship followed over the meal which was served right at the start. Following dinner, John Ellis was invited to report on the activity over the previous weekend which he and President Jim took part in. This was the dismantling and cleanout of the District 9685 office at Thornleigh and the storing of much of the equipment, etc. at Kennards Storage at Thornleigh. They were aided in this by DG Kalma, DGE David Clark, and a couple of other rotarians. It was all done and dusted in under 2 hours.

Jason Terry then advised that he is holding a Rotaract Information Night on 23rd June. It will be a Zoom meeting aimed primarily at potential members. However he wants members of our club and West Pennant Hills/Cherrybrook club to log on to demonstrate our support - support that will be ongoing. Both the current District Governor and the incoming District Governor will be joining the meeting. Jason will advise the log on details shortly.

Phil Stanton provided an update on the saga surrounding a talk by the Community Engagement Advisor from Transurban who had approached us about coming to tell us about a Community Event with the opening of NorthConnex. Phil has had considerable trouble achieving any sort of engagement with him, however he has spoken to him and he is prepared to come to a meeting provided we supply beforehand the safety conditions to be observed at the meeting. Phil has decided to get the golf club to supply their safety arrangements governing functions at the club, and has made a booking for July 8 for us to hear about Transurban's plans.

President Jim invited John Ellis with his Youth hat firmly on to advise that the *Young Endeavour* program for January is uncertain at present due to the postponing of sailings during the lockdown. They are looking to accommodate those who's voyages were postponed once they are allowed to resume, so this may mean January sailings being taken up by those people. John will keep in contact with them. He also noted that to date he has received no applications for National Youth Science Forum in January 2021. (Editor's Note: This week, following the meeting, an application has been received which John is assessing before submitting to district.)

We then moved to a general discussion about Changeover on July 1st. David Firth confirmed that he had spoken to Nicole Tanner from the golf club to establish if we could have a larger number than 20 which is the current capacity of each of the function rooms and the answer was that they would be happy to open up a second room to lift capacity to atleast 40. There was discussion about invitees with the decision being to invite DG Kalma, DGE David, and representatives from Hornsby Hospital, St Lucy's School and The Banna Group. Jack Reid undertook to take the numbers for the meeting. It was agreed that we should have a 2 course menu - main + dessert. President Jim and David Firth to confer on other aspects of the evening and program.

David Firth then sought some assistance for the coming year. He is looking for an editor for Spokes. Another task was Sergeant-at-arms which drew an immediate and enthusiastic volunteer in President Jim!

President Jim then closed the meeting with the anthem - not sure if we can do that when singing is not allowed in church services.
