Meeting Report

This was the night that Phil Stanton had arranged a presentation on the North Connex opening. Jim Fraser dinged the dong at 6.30pm and opened the meeting. Grace was said by all and the President welcomed guests Ester Fraser, Heather Firth and Georgia Glockemann.

The President updated the members on Ian Huckel's recovery. He is currently in the Geraghty Rehabilitation Ward in Hornsby Hospital on the 4th floor and will probably be there for another 10 days while he works on his stability. He can receive visitors, but only one at a time. Terry Pankhurst was also recovering satisfactorily.

Pat Parker gave a briefing on The Tree of Joy and the trailer raffle. He has contacted 10 shopping centres and has received approval from 8 out of 10 centres.

Kaye Carter spoke about preparing knitted/crocheted poppies for Remembrance Day as a recruitment drive activity. These will be attached to cards. Samples of the poppies were shown to members. David Firth said he would send out a copy of Heather's pattern for making poppies (with Spokes) as Heather had previously made some for the Hornsby Hospital. Kaye also mentioned that the golf club dining nights would be factored into the future social nights, so there is less clash in activities.

John Ellis gave an update on RYLA. He mentioned Jason Terry from the recently formed Rotaract Club and that our club would support one of his members. However, RYLA may not eventuate next January.



After our meal was served, Pat's guests, Geoff Ashton and Ken Lynch, arrived to hear the presentation. A couple of other golf club members also joined the room to listen to the presentation.

Just after 7pm, our chairman, Phil Stanton introduced Raj Barot and his representatives from the different divisions to present on the North Connex Project Update. We were provided with an overview of the project and the need for the tunnel. In essence, no date is known yet

when the tunnel will open, as it may be a couple of months before all testing has been completed.

Some of the topics covered were:

- Benefits of the tunnel
- Stages of the tunnel now at the testing and commissioning final phase still have some tests to complete
- Entry and exit points plus the overhead bicycle track
- Four water treatment plants (some members were very interested in this aspect)
- Tolling costs \$7.91 for cars; \$23.73 for trucks & buses
- Tunnel maintenance closure will close every 3 months (maintenance between 10pm and 5am)
- In-tunnel lighting to maintain driver's alertness
- Incident management
- Opening communications no community open event



Meeting Report Cont.


