So we can all look for items that can help or if you are able, to check items donated to ensure they are going to work. Depending on the results, we may well have a project we can take to many aged care facilities in our community.

Finally, don't forget the District Governor's Official Visit on Monday August 31st. it would be good to have as many at this meeting as possible, particularly as we will induct Ida into the club that evening. For those who cannot attend, we hope to be able to zoom the meeting. Please let me know if you are coming or not by Friday next.
