John firstly gave us some background information about the HM Bark Endeavour Replica. The initial idea of recreating Endeavour for use was born during the establishment of a national maritime museum in Sydney for the bicentenary of



Australia in 1988. It was planned as a bicentenary gift to the nation from the Bond Corporation. However, due to some funding problems, the Endeavour replica was not completed until 1994.



Because John was interested in the project, he became a tour guide when the replica arrived in Sydney in 1944.

In 1995 John joined the replica for the voyage to Eden and back. Later in 2002, when John was only 62 years old, he was encouraged by his wife and decided to take on one of the Endeavour's 2002 arrangements sailing from Hobart to Rio de Janeiro.

Following some professional knowledge about the construction of Endeavour, John showed us a video, full of fascinating insights into his 11-week voyage. Prior to sailing on 25 Feb 2002, they were put through aspects of survival training, jumping into the water (11°) and scrambling into a life raft. We got to know their living space and daily fun activities in the ship, such as making mats and gloves, etc. (More details are not recorded here) More importantly, we

got to see a bearded 62-year-old John!

After a heated Q&A session, our versatile President David admitted that he had just watched 30 seconds of the video and knew he couldn't make such a trip. Then proudly, the President invited our sailing hero John to draw the lucky door prize which JACK WON. Everyone seemed excited, like they themselves won. Cheer for Jack!
