


With regard to the distress in Timor Leste and the call for funds to help our RYLA/RYPEN alumni in their efforts to assist those devastated by the flooding, we have been able to forward \$3,000 to their account there, the funds coming from a District Grant received last October but delayed in forwarding due to the COVID problems.

Rotary Opens Opportunities

Our Pride of Workmanship Awards night is looking like we will have a good number of awardees to recognise. The function promises to be an excellent event with our Keynote Speaker, District Governor Elect Lindsay May, providing an excellent message for those in attendance. Please invite friends and family, particularly anyone you think may be interested in Rotary. The date is Wednesday, 19th May, at 6.30 for 7.00pm start. We'll have a 2 course meal at a cost of \$45 each.

At our recent board meeting it was decided that we would donate \$2,500 to the End Polio Now campaign. Given the disruption to this drive to eliminate polio that the COVID pandemic has provided, it is encouraging to learn of the following developments – "Polio immunization activities began resuming in July 2020, with precautions taken to protect frontline workers and communities. With funding from Rotary members, Rotary issued more



than \$50 million in PolioPlus grants in June to support polio eradication work in Afghanistan and Pakistan (the last two countries where wild polio remains endemic) and across Africa. In Afghanistan, communications and community outreach work (called "social mobilization") is crucial; this has included distributing 3 million bars of soap to promote hygiene, protect against polio and COVID-19, and improve local reception of vaccination efforts. In Pakistan, the social mobilization effort has a special focus on outreach to local religious leaders, who can promote vaccinations in mosque announcements

and sermons." Our donation will, like all other Rotary club donations, attract the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation doubling grant so that \$7,500 will go into the End Polio Now funds.
