


This Week Members' Night Recap on last week's Zoom visits By Zoom

ROTARY CLUB OF BECKENHAM, Kent, U.K. District 1120


To President Brian Cooke and the members numbering around 40 who meet each week on Thursdays at 12.30 for 1.00pm at the Park Langley Club in Beckenham. The club was chartered on 18th October 1934.

Some of their Community activities include support for - Bowlers Hospital Amenities Fund, Laptops for Schools & Charities, and Virtual Balloon Race which raised money for 2 charities supporting disadvantaged children. In November they hold a Poppy Appeal

raising funds for the Royal British Legion. Last year they raised over £40,000! They have a very active social program and have been involved in a range of International projects in recent years.

Beckenham is a town in Greater London, within the London Borough of Bromley and the historic county of Kent.

Beckenham was, until the coming of the railway in 1857, a small village, with



The town, directly west of Bromley, has areas of commerce and industry, principally around the curved network of streets featuring its high street and is served in transport by three main railway stations — nine within the post town — plus towards its western periphery two Tramlink stations. In common with the rest of Bromley, the largest borough of London by area, Beckenham has several pockets of recreational land which are a mixture of sports grounds, fishing ponds and parks.

Meals Plus is a day centre in the heart Parramatta providing basic needs and support to people who are homeless or disadvantaged. Meals Plus works to break the cycle of homelessness by providing quick solutions for people in need of emergency support. It is an entry point into

Parramatta Mission's community services. Meals Plus is open for breakfast and lunch from Monday to Friday. Services include: emergency food assistance, laundry and shower facilities, financial counselling, legal advice by visiting solicitors, housing advocacy, Centrelink outreach service and referral to accommodation services.
