Rotary Leadership Institute seeks to have Rotary Clubs identify those Rotarians who appear to have the potential for future club leadership (not necessarily as club presidents) and provide those so identified with a quality education in Rotary knowledge and leadership skills which is important in voluntary organisations.

The concise weekend course is held Friday nights (6-7pm), Saturdays and Sundays either by Zoom or at a venue to be advised. Online courses start 8am Sat and Sun and are divided into 3x2hr blocks each day finishing 4pm. For face to face courses, morning tea and lunch are provided. Arrive each day at 8:15am for a prompt 8.30am start and a finish around 4pm.

- Concise online weekend course: Fri night 6-7pm; both Saturday and Sunday 8am-4pm (3x 2hr sessions each day with breaks).
- Zoom link and pre-work to be distributed in week prior.
- Cost is only \$30/head payable on registration and we recommend that clubs reimburse participants once they have completed the course. Our club will reimburse this cost to members.
- Registrants should have **at least 12 months Rotary experience** under their belt in order to gain the most out of the course it is not an introduction to Rotary.
- RLI is excellent training for Presidents-Elect and all board members
