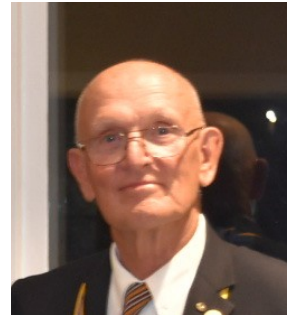

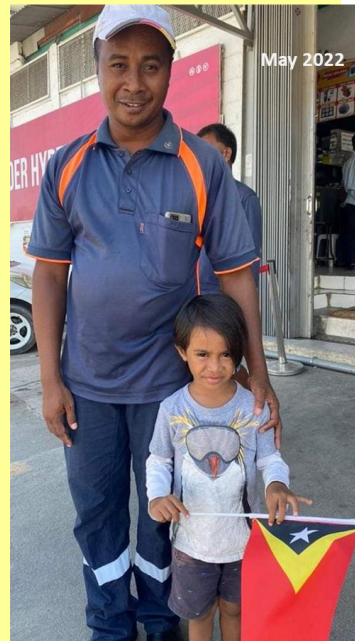
ROMAC IN ACTION: TIMOR LESTE
