MEETING REPORT 21ST SEPTEMBER


President Phil Stanton opened this meeting and welcomed PDG Pam Pritchard from Turramurra, our guest speaker. President Phil then covered some of our themes to gain local publicity. Anoop Sud, home from a journey to India, reported on his visit to our sister club, Delhi Ridge. That club sponsors women's shelters and makes shopping bags for the women. Also they finance hair dryers for women keen to establish a beauty salon. Theo Glockemann covered his forthcoming visit to East Timor in a month's time, his 19th visit to watch over RYLA and RYPEN. Adrian Bell passed on favourable comments from Barker students who had experienced the East Timor programs.

President Phil introduced Pam Pritchard whose address covered the work of her club in the East Moree Public School. The present population of Moree includes a considerable number of people of Aboriginal descent



and even today, they are marginalized and discriminated against in town. One consequence is the two primary schools in town – one, East Moree, is for the Aboriginal children and one, Moree, is for the others. As the pandemic spread, school children everywhere began to work from home. This highlighted centres of disadvantage, such as East Moree with some 200 students from K to 6, where access to computers was quite limited. The Principal, Lorinda Potter, found that she would require 117 computers to give her flock a decent chance to study from home. This quandary came to the attention of the RC of Turramurra and Pam took up the challenge – how to acquire laptops and iPads and

raise funds for same. As well as her club, Pam called on some other clubs in Sydney and the two in Moree. Ms Potter called on Uncle Mac, a Queensland artist, to decorate a pavement that will give students some background to their culture. Pam also saw the need for shade in the



to start with and the remainder to follow. On visiting the school Pam was greeted with Welcome to Country in Gamilaaray, their local language. Since a general return to classroom teaching a school cafeteria now provides children with lunches and for some breakfast as well. Pam covered the sums required for the computers, umbrellas and another aspect – Books at Home. A not for profit group, Books in House, started in New Zealand in 1993 and came to Australia in 2001. The theme is to encourage reading



outside school so that a student will take home three books each term. Pam went to Books in House and


introduced the program in East Moree. Since then Ms Potter has been able to report on a general improvement in literacy. Financing these projects has required many dollars -\$14,000, and Pam gave us an account of the schemes at Turramurra, some Sydney clubs, the Moree clubs and the Moree Rotary District to bring in this amount. She mentioned pudding sales and also a forthcoming Trivia Night, inviting the brains trust from Pennant Hills to join in. Pam told us that the umbrellas took quite some time to install, as heavy concrete bases were necessary. Then in July this year she and five other Rotarians went to Moree for the grand opening that coincided with NAIDOC Week. Day 1 included a Welcome to Country, thanks for the books and a Welcome cake. Lorinda Potter, the Principal for the past five years, was presented with a Paul Harris Fellowship. Day 2 included a visit to local galleries then to Moree Rotary Club for dinner. Day 3 covered NAIDOC celebrations, Welcome to County and the National Anthem in the Gamilaaray language and Uncle Mac giving a talk about didgeridoos and boomerangs. The students presented the visitors with shopping bags they had decorated.



At question time Theo Glockemann raised the possibilities for RYPEN in Moree. Pam indicated that the local clubs did not seem to be overly interested in such. President Phil thanked Pam for a most interesting talk that covered quite a challenge. As the meeting drew to a close Adrian Bell presented some photos of Chez Bell at Burradoo then he ran through a possible fund raiser – the Lemon Trophy.

With discussion then winding up, President Phil reminded members of the social gathering next week then closed the meeting.
