MEETING REPORT - OCTOBER 19

President Phil Stanton opened this meeting then David Firth reported on the funeral of Arthur Jerome earlier that afternoon. Arthur, who had been an active member of this Club, had been in full time care for the past three years. David then wished Theo and Georgia Glockemann a safe sojourn in East Timor as they pack to leave this Friday. World Polio Day is this weekend and will see the Great Train Ride, a Polio fundraiser, passing through Pennant Hills on 24 October.

Ray White, the real estate agency, is planning a community program to collect clothing, food, toys and such to distribute locally. The Club has been contacted to suggest possible beneficiaries and this is seen as a way to have the Club's name before the local community. Fay Kitto, RC of North Rocks, has passed details of a theatre evening on 16 November where Picasso meets Einstein. David suggested we might consider this for our social evening next month.

DG Mina Howard is scheduled to visit this Club on 9 November and it was agreed we should

investigate arrangements for a meal for the occasion. David then confirmed that he has had a favourable response from the Pennant Hills Civic Trust to speak to us on 23 November.

The next item was our Trailer Raffle ticket sales. Terry Pankhurst reported that the trailer was ready to venture out in public with a new raincoat. And with wet weather likely, a suitable umbrella will be desirable when we are in exposed locations.

David Firth then introduced the topic for this evening – Pride of Workmanship. He had the promotional stand that displayed the different forms of the award including the original yellow backing on tinplate with blue lettering. This format is now printed on a plastic sheet. There has not been much demand for this format in recent years and the shield format is now the most in demand. The display included the rectangular plague that is still popular



in many Clubs. David displayed a graph showing sales results over the 40 years the project has been running. Twenty years ago we were selling \$55,000 worth of trophies p.a. In 2012 RI dropped Avenues of Service and Vocational service from the Rotary theme and our PoW sales started to decline. Many Districts and Clubs in Australia have dropped Vocational service. Nevertheless we continue to retain regular customers and we do gain new customers from time to time. With contact details within Clubs changing yearly it is not straightforward to maintain continuing contact with a particular Club. We advertise in RDU and we have a website for PoW as well as our Club website. The PoW site includes trophy options and testimonials from customers. David then showed members how trophies are assembled from a wooden backing sourced from China and a metal badge sourced from Bankstown. Customers can order on line and David can arrange delivery of trophies without engraving within 48 hours. When engraving is desired, items will go out in five days. Because of postage charges these day deliveries in and around Sydney will go via courier. Australia Post handles all other deliveries. More recently COVID matters have added to this downward trend. David covered our operating costs advertising in RDU, web site maintenance, printing and so on. David gave examples of difficult customers - mainly Clubs that require much chasing for payment. Discussion followed with comments on cheaper products, a Facebook page and reviews of the market. For our newer members, David's presentation gave a very good overview.

With discussion then winding up, President Phil then closed the meeting.


