

President David Firth opened our Annual General Meeting and welcomed our RYLA candidate, Aaron Muston. Georgia Glockemann, recently home from hospital, was mentioned in the welfare report. John Ellis, having represented the Club at Speech Night at Pennant Hills High School, reported on the evening where this Club presents leadership awards to the head girl and boy. Jason Terry introduced Aaron Muston from Hills Rotaract, our candidate for RYLA. Aaron has been green keeper at Muirfield Golf Club for some time and is now captain of his local cricket team. President David then called for assistance to deliver gifts from our Trees of Joy to Stewart House on Friday 9 December and to Parramatta Mission on Tuesday 13 December. John Ellis and Jim Fraser responded to this call. Gift wrapping at Hornsby Westfield on Friday 16 December, organised by Ida Shi, required support and John Ellis and Jim Fraser came forward. President David relayed a Christmas greeting from former member, Robert Rutishauser, now a member of RC of Port Macquarie. The President then called on Jim Fraser to report on the recent delivery of flood relief support to Eugowra. After a drive of 4 ½ hours, Jim took a utility load of food and other supplies to this flood stricken township to be met with scenes of devastation he had not previously witnessed. He reported on support coming from other sources, locals living in caravans and the need for containers for storage and the website listing desired items. Despite their privations, Jim relayed the cheerfulness of the locals. He shared a tent with most of the local mosquitoes. Pam Hudson covered our awareness of the need for support and the assembly of items here before arranging transport. She covered other Rotary Clubs and support groups who responded to the cause, stressing the demand for cleaning equipment.

President David explained a problem with presenting minutes of the AGM for 2021 and offered the report of the meeting covered in Spokes. This record was accepted. He also presented the financial report that would have come from Terry Pankhurst who was presently stranded in some cruise ship. The accounts were accepted and will be confirmed once audited by Mrs Mathie. The meeting approved that John Ellis prepare and sign the Dept of Fair Trading report that follows an AGM.

The election of officers for 2023-24 followed:

President – initially there being no nominations, the position remained vacant, however later in the meeting Jason Terry accepted nomination and was accepted on the basis of sharing with another member.

John Ellis and I made the trek over to Curl Curl last Friday morning. We had a carload of presents for children aged 7 to 15. On arrival, we received a warm welcome from Murray O'Donnel and his assistant, Olga.

After bringing the gifts inside, we managed to take a couple of photos - see below - and then Murray gave John a walk around the main building and explained the operation. Their current intake is about 70 children from far western NSW - Broken Hill and Bourke area mainly. They spend 2 weeks at Stewart House, giving them a break away from their home and family. Murray emphasised that they are a wellness establishment, not just an education establishment. They do provide schooling on site, but also a lot of health services as well as other activities.
