Robyn and Michael started their own school teaching Science and Maths based subjects.

Another avenue of employment was working as an interpreter for FIA where she met numerous famous people including Max Moseley. Robyn enjoyed the travelling and meeting different people and their cultures.

Returning to Australia with her sons she enrolled in a Cordon Bleu Course studying pastries. Robyn tried special muffins, pies and savoury items when starting her shop but found these too expensive for locals. She now produces popular items and also catering for functions.

Robyn's husband is currently still running their schooling in South Korea and returns to Australia on a regular basis.

Robyn was asked lots of questions and broadened our knowledge of South Korea and their culture. We may well have a Korean BBQ in late May.
