By this time DG Christine had had something to eat, so she commenced her address to our club. The slogan for this year is "Create Hope in the World". "Hope" for many people is disappearing in our fast paced world. Acknowledging people and saying "G'day" might just help make our world a better place. It is sad that the Rotary Club of North Sydney, one year short of its hundredth anniversary will soon be no more. Perhaps a fresh start of a new club might fill the void. The DG informed us that 33% of Rotarians in our District's sixty four clubs are female – short of the 50% that could be expected – and that there are still a handful of men-only clubs.

The DG outlined four preferences for the year -

"You" as a Rotarian – be proudly engaged in Rotary matters;

Collaborate with other clubs with projects;

Support the Rotary Foundation;

Support for the Domestic Violence Campaign – check the District Website for walks in association with local Councils.

Questions to the DG included -

From your reporter – a suggestion that our club's Timor experience could be duplicated;

The District hold financial reserves well in excess of those

required by RI Rules, including \$100,000 in Youth Project Reserves. Could not much of the unneeded surpluses held be used to subsidise future programs, thus making it cheaper for clubs to participate? Could both the two RYPEN and three MUNA accounts be consolidated

and cut by half and the surplus used to subsidise future campaigns? The DG advised that an approach from a Rotarian was required so that the matter could be addressed by COTA. Your reporter has now made the necessary approach.

President David raised the Rotary License issue as it affects our POW project. The absurdity of Rotary charging Rotary for a Rotary owned logo!

Will his TV involvement in any way affect his Rotary involvement? And has he told his wife about his new career?

WALK AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

This is an annual event involving the Women's Shed Hornsby Ku-ring-gai, KNC, Multi-cultural groups, Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command, Hornsby Council, PCYC, etc. The event and walk this year are set for the morning of Wednesday 6 December and will start and finish at the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai PCYC. A route plan for the walk has been approved by the Hornsby police. Students from Hornsby Girl's High School and Normanhurst Boy's HS will take part in the event. The Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Women's Shelter and Wahroonga Rotary have been invited to take part.

Gather at the PCYC in Waitara at 8.30am. The walk concludes at 10.30am with morning tea. This is a map of the route.
