

#### **CHRISTMAS TRAILER RAFFLE PROGRESS**

The reception our teams received at West Pennant Hills outside Coles was better than we received last year. The early team of Jack Reid, John Ellis and David Firth, after a quiet start, managed to keep busy through to changeover at 11am. The relief team comprised Ahmadul Ameen (who actually arrived soon after 10.30 to receive training from John Ellis), Pat Parker and Jim Fraser, and they continued good sales through to 2pm. Phil Stanton returned the trailer to the Ellis residence. In all 380 tickets were sold, bringing in \$658.25. This surpassed last year when sales were 291 and takings of \$520. Year to date total is \$4990.

#### **MEETING REPORT - 26th November**

Our man in charge of programs had secured a speaker for the meeting, Michael Eyles, a friend of his from the golf club and a member of the recent golfing and sightseeing trip to South Africa. President Adrian welcomed Michael to the meeting and also Dr Leon Edena, Kaye Carter's partner. Leon had come along in particular because of his interest in Africa and its fauna.

President Adrian reminded everyone of the AGM next week and the various positions to be filled at the elections. He suggested, in the absence of nominations or volunteers, that it would not be a good idea not to attend! There followed a discussion about the difficulty experienced at Cherrybrook Shopping Centre with the trailer raffle on Saturday. It appears there was a mix up over the paperwork with the booking resulting in security staff not expecting us to be there. Pat Parker undertook to talk to the contact person. A reminder was given about the manning of the trailer raffle next Saturday at West Pennant Hills shops. Additional recruits were John Ellis, Ahmadul Ameen and Pat Parker, with Phil Stanton offering to collect the trailer and return it to John Ellis' home.

Pat Parker explained the delay in the start of the Tree of Joy at Pennant Hills Market Place. As the centre organises the tree and decorations, we have to wait for that to happen. This year the installation has been delayed, however he expected that it would be done on Wednesday morning. Fortunately, we learned that there is a later group going into Stewart House with presents for them needed on Monday 17th December. The plan is to deliver gifts to Parramatta Mission the following day.

Kaye Walker then told us of her recent conversation with Keri Chittenden from 'So They Can'. Kaye said she was very interested in what they were doing, but being involved in education, she felt moved to do something about paying for desks for the students - Keri had told us that one of the requirements at enrolment was for students to pay for a desk to use. Keri had told Kaye that the price of the desks is \$40.60 and they are sourced locally in Kenya. Kaye announced that she was going to pay for some and invited other members to join her. President Adrian, following general endorsement of Kaye's proposal, suggested that we do this through the club with the treasurer bringing the EFTPOS machine along each week so members can contribute through their credit or debit cards.

Phil Stanton introduced Michael Eyles. Michael went on the trip to South Africa although he no longer plays golf due to an arm injury. Fortunately, that has not affected his photography skills. He set in motion a slide show of photos he had taken on the trip of birds and animals. He provided background information on many of the species - he obviously specialises in bird photos and many of those he showed were simply brilliant. He had some amazing animal photos which appeared to have been taken at dangerously close range. Animals such as cheetahs, lions, rhinos, etc., but he also had wonderful shots of the less photogenic species like hyenas and wart hogs. A couple of the highlights for me were the picture of a cheetah up in a tree with its kill safely stored up there too, and a picture of a lion beautifully camouflaged amongst some grass and bushes demonstrating how easily one could stumble into trouble. I liked Michael's comment about going on a walk in one of the parks with a ranger who carried a large rifle. When asked about the gun, the ranger admitted that it was only for show!

Michael also showed pictures and video taken on the trip not associated with the animals and birds. There were some of the golfing party at one or two of the prestigious golf courses that they played. But more importantly, he showed pictures and a video of the gifting of school supplies to children in a disadvantaged school. The children knew they were coming so they had prepared a concert for their visitors.

Following some questions and comments, Michael was thanked for his wonderful presentation and the meeting was closed by the president.
