

We were back at the "old place" – The Pennant Hills Bowling Club -for this meeting and our magnificent eleven clearly outnumbered the regulars. It was reported that Terry went to the wrong place, but this was denied, he was merely checking out the W P H Sports Club as a future alternative meeting place. The trains were late so the President arrived after the start of the meeting. There was considerable discussion on the selection of a meal, and after a long evaluation of the various options, I think that the fish and chips was selected as the favourite dish, closely followed by the pie. Some members elected to continue with deserts, but most of the group decided to take advantage of the cheap meal night.

The President reported that next weeks meeting would be back at the Golf Club but warned that there were going to be major disruptions in the months to come, due to the previously advised building works.

A considerable number of enquiries had been made by the President into other venue options, when the Pennant Hills Golf Club will not be available to us, and these alternative places included, the Pennant Hills Bowling Club, West Pennant Hills Sports Club and Pennant Hills Hotel. His enquiries included-room hire fees, prices for set menus and individual meals, as well as an option for a separate room. It appeared that the Hotel may be the best option and the President will continue to obtain the result for the club.

Annual Charity Golf Day- Pennant Hills Golf Course

It was noted that the golf day was currently scheduled for Tuesday 11th September, with a 12.30 pm shot gun start. There was a great deal of discussion on the selection of the day, due to a number of members being away on Rotary projects as well as some problems associated with the building works. It was left in the hands of golf chairman Phil, assisted by Terry to further investigate the current scheduling.

Correspondence was received from St Lucys School at Wahroonga, thanking the club for our support and donation, and it was noted that the school would again be the recipient of a significant portion of funds raised by the annual Christmas Trailer Raffle.

2019 NSW Seniors Festival Grants Program.

David Firth reported that he had received correspondence from Lauren Gumley of Damien Tudehope's office (Member for Epping), advising details of the NSW state grants program. David suggested that it could be a great opportunity to have a Rotary Week Promotion at Pennant Hills Market Town, especially as the club was selling raffle tickets there on Saturday 13th October and Saturday 15th December. In addition, the Tree Of Joy would be erected at the centre around the middle of November and it could also be possible to arrange a sausage sizzle with the support of the IGA store and the help of Nicole Bondoc from the Banna management of the centre. It was decided to further investigate all of the options available to promote the club and encourage new members from the local area.

Ryda-Mount St Benedicts School

The project director advised that the school would be attending Sydney Olympic Park on Tuesday 4th September, and hoped that the club could arrange for 6 members to support the school on this day.


