

MEETING REPORT - 30th July - Reporter: David Firth

Our meeting promised to be busy as we had a guest speaker booked, a student from Cheltenham Girls High School coming to tell us about her interest in space and her request for financial support, and a number of program and organisational matters to be discussed. Indeed, how would we fit all this in?

The treasurer continues to be pressured by some of his 'customers', however it all seems like 'water off a ducks back' to unflappable Terry.

President Adrian opened the meeting in the usual way and welcomed our student visitor, Taran McDermid and her father. John Ellis, the club's King of the Kids, introduced Taran. He proceeded to tell us of her interest in space and astronomy - her dad is an astronomer (Phil Stanton he looks like a likely guest speaker!). Taran was aided by a powerpoint slide show as well. The essence of her brief talk was as follows -

She has been selected to take part in a 2 week trip to the United States at the end of the year. She is one of just 30 junior high school students selected. She needs to raise \$4,000 by the end of September and has a fundraising page on the internet to aid in that effort. Details of this page are on page 4 of this Spokes issue. The following is from that page and from her presentation to us -

'I have always been fascinated by science. Learning from professional astronautical engineers, and seeing how technology can be developed to ensure our future in space, would be hugely inspiring for me, and show me where my own future might lead. I'm particularly excited to learn from NASA's educators, and bring that knowledge home with me to inspire other young people about space.

To make this trip possible, I am trying to raise funds to cover the expenses involved, and I need your help to reach my goal of raising \$4000 by the end of September. I will be so grateful for anything you can donate to make this experience a reality for me.'

Taran was congratulated on her fine presentation - she is just 14 years old and in year 8 at school and spoke very confidently. Following her departure from the meeting it was agreed to support her with a \$500 donation.

After dinner, with the guest speaker a 'no show', we got down to dealing with a number of matters. President Adrian advised that Norwest Sunrise Rotary Club who is organizing the meeting on 13th August has had to move the meeting to Springfield House, Dural due to the large number attending. They are now expecting around 170 at that meeting. The following meeting on 20th August will be our last at the Golf Club until the renovations are completed. (Late final extra - this week is our last meeting at the Golf Club!). As the storage area at the Golf Club will not be accessible during the renovations, it was agreed that we will lease a small unit at Storage King in Sefton Road, Thornleigh at a cost of \$125 per month. David Firth agreed to handle this and arrange the removal of our equipment from the Golf Club.

In Phil Stanton's absence at a Golf Club board meeting, Terry Pankhurst spoke about the Golf Day for which we have a booking on September 11th. However, although the club felt they could still host it, Terry and Phil had considered an alternative of early March 2019 and felt that it was a preferable time. The meeting agreed to the postponement.

Theo spoke about the approaching East Timor visit for which the club has been given a \$6,000 district grant however the funds will be split into 2 amounts of \$3,000, one paid prior and the other after the RYPEN sessions hadve been completed. Theo sought agreement that the club would underwrite the shortfall of \$3,000 until it was available from district.

President Adrian closed the meeting in the usual way at 8.45pm.



The highlight of this trip for me is the last week. We will fly to Houston, Texas, and participate in a challenging 5-day educational program at NASA's Space University. Here we will learn about topics such as robotics, rocketry, and how to journey to and live on Mars.
