

MEETING REPORT - 9th May, 2016

Following opening the meeting, President Ian welcomed David Boyce from the Rotary Club of Dili, who joined us as he is staying with Theo & Georgia having been on the District 9550 Conference which was a cruise from Sydney up to Queensland and back for 4 days.

We then welcomed Jamie Davidson, president of the Pennant Hills Public School P & C, who spoke about their up coming Annual Fete on Sunday 22nd May at the Infants School in Trebor Road. He was looking for volunteers to assist on the day - he noted that the W Group are major sponsors of the fete. Four members volunteered - John Ellis, Ian Chappel, Theo Glockemann, and David Firth - for duty from 11.00am to approx. 2.00pm.

David Boyce was invited to tell us what his club and Rotary are doing in East Timor. Their club is primarily involved in the essential task of providing clean water to remote villages. They also get involved with numerous other projects supported by clubs in Australia and elsewhere. He advised that a second club is being chartered, essentially made up of alumni from our RYLA program there. District 9550 will be heavily subsidising the membership costs of that club as many members are not working.

David Firth gave a rundown of preparations for the Pride of Workmanship Awards Night including tasks for various members to perform on the night, and asking members to be there by 6.30pm to welcome the guests and enjoy fellowship with them. At the end of his rundown, David presented a Pride of Workmanship promotion kit and trophy to David Boyce to take back to his club.


Theo Glockemann gave a short burst on the Rotary Foundation and then followed with a brief summary of the District 9550 Conference cruise which he and Georgia went on - Theo being a guest presenter. He felt the cruise worked well and appeared relatively good value for money. He was also very impressed with the RI President's representative to the conference and what he had to say.

President Ian then presented a special lapel pin from RI in recognition of nominating Alex Thomas for membership. Alex was then moved to tell us of his recent experiences at a Kairos visit to Parklea Prison over 4 days - a chance to have fellowship with inmates who expressed interest in meeting with his Christian team. He also spoke in glowing terms of his attendance at the Rotary Leadership Institute where he learned a lot more about our organisation. He also mentioned visiting Hobart with his wife for a conference. The sergeant followed with a concentrated 'attack' on Michael Bradley who was just back from a trip to Canada to check whether Jim Fraser was accurate in his talk the other week about his birthplace.

The Board Meeting followed with the specific business including a review of our membership breakfast. There was a suggestion that we hold these quarterly. It was also suggested that a booth be tried at Pennant Hills Marketplace. President Ian advised that we need to have a Child Protection Policy and procedures included in our By-laws. In discussing our involvement with the PKU Research Project at Westmead, Terry Pankhurst explained that Professor John Christodoulou has taken a position in Melbourne at the Murdoch Institute but will continue to have oversight of the PKU project. They are looking to go to clinical trials within 6 months, the process costing approx. \$250,000. The funds from our golf day will be added to \$170,000 which the PKU Association has on hand. A further function will be required to raise the balance. The Red Shield Appeal plans are coming together although Child Protection is an issue for driver recruitment. Finally, board members were reminded that reports for the Club Annual Report are required by the end of May. A committee of President, President Elect and Secretary will organise the Changeover to be held on June 27th. **Reporter: The Editor** The annual Red Shield Appeal is gearing up in our area with Chairman Theo, ably assisted by PE Pam, already involved in planning and recruiting collectors and drivers. Our concerns about lack of support from the Salvation Army in past years have been aired.

We need to show our support by volunteering to assist on the day and to seek others who might help as drivers or collectors, remembering that there will be static collections on the previous weekend.

The doorknock is on Sunday May 29th.
