Pakuranga Rotary - NZ Tour 2017 for Australian Rotarians

President Pam received the following email from Rotarian Peter Hawkins, Tour Co-ordinator, Rotary Club of Pakuranga Inc.

After analysing a questionnaire sent to 4,645 Australian Rotarians via their Rotary Clubs, we (the Auckland Rotary Club of Pakuranga) have tailored the following tour of New Zealand which includes Rotary events.

This tour is 2 weeks long, covers both islands and includes a Rotary host couple and a professional Tour Guide. We are also limiting the quantity of participants to 30 maximum to ensure it is manageable, friendly and that all participants will be fully involved. So once we get 30 participants we will be closing applications.

The tour starts on the 30th March 2017 and runs through to Friday 14th April (Easter Friday). Several meals and tours are included within the price. There are also some 'free periods' where you can select what you would prefer to do, and pay direct.

Tour Prices: AU\$4,990 per person share twin. AU\$6,490 Single per person

These prices include airport meet and greet by Pakuranga Rotarians on 30th March, accommodation as per the itinerary, official Rotarian welcome at Mercure Auckland Hotel, gift packs.

Coach transport from 31st March to 13th April, professional tour guide from 31st March to 14th April, guided tour of Auckland, entry to Kelly Tarlton's Sea Life Aquarium, entry to Auckland Museum, guided tour of flora and fauna section of Auckland Museum, entry to Sky Tower, Devonport to Auckland ferry tickets, tea tour and tastings at Zealong Estate, 2 hr guided tour of Hobbiton.

Rotorua. Entry to Rainbow Springs, Agrodome sheep show, guided tour of Te Puia, Maori concert and hangi dinner at Te Puia. Sightseeing tour of Wellington, guided tour of Weta Workshop, ferry from Wellington to Picton, wine tasting at Brancott Estate, orientation tour of Christchurch, guided walking tour of Dunedin, guided tour of Olveston historic home, sight-seeing tour of Dunedin, Royal Albatross Centre tour, Elm Wildlife Tour, and New Zealand Goods and Services Tax at 15%.

The prices also include all breakfasts and 7 dinners. All lunches and 7 dinners are your care.

Great meeting. No boring old reports, no Sergeant and best of all – no prattle from Beecroft.


Advance Australia. Go Home. Return to normal next week.
